<u>The Hub</u>

As a Hub volunteer, I am often asked :

- What's The Hub about?
- What do you have to do?
- Does it really work?

Here are my answers to these questions.

What is the Hub about?

For me, The Hub is about giving a friendly face to our Church on week days. Many of us call into the church for a variety of reasons - to drop something off, to collect something, to see Wendy on business, or to attend a meeting. We usually intend to dash in and out and be on our way, BUT - on Tuesdays and Thursdays, between 10.00 am and 2.00 pm you will hear some music playing in the foyer, and a group of people sitting around a coffee table, drinking tea or coffee, and eating too many of Judith's legendary biscuits, while busily engaged in catching up with each other. Very few people resist the opportunity to stop and join in. Many find themselves still there twenty minutes later, having caught up with someone they haven't seen for ages or having at last put a name to a familiar face. While this may be seen as providing hospitality to only those within the Church family, this has proved to be unexpectedly valuable. Moreover, it presents a warm and inviting image to passers-by who sometimes drop in to see what's going on, to people from the community who have come to make enquiries, and to some lonely people who are glad of a hot drink and a chat.

What do The Hub volunteers do?

They talk!

They welcome everyone who comes in.

They answer questions.

They make cups of tea, dispense biscuits ,(and wash up afterwards!)

They listen.

They see what goes on in the life of our Church, and are glad to be part of it.

Does it work?

Why don't you come and find out?
