Our theme for the term is Joshua and our focus verse is "**Do not be terrified, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go**" **Joshua 1:9** In the Adult Discussion Group time of our 4.30 pm worship, we are having some inspiring speakers and we welcome you to come and join us. Invite your friends to come and hear some everyday Christians share of how God has been with them in their journey. The speakers will speak for 45 minutes from 5.00 pm to 5.45 pm but you are welcome to come to the whole service which goes from 4.30 pm and finishes with dinner for \$2 at 6.00 pm.

Sunday 12 September – God with us in the tragedy of Black Saturday and in the journey afterwards. At the time of Black Saturday Anthony Stokes was living on 500 acres in Upper Plenty. His parents also had a house on this property. Anthony's wife was 8 months pregnant as was his brother's wife. On Black Saturday Anthony, his parents, his brother Matthew and a family friend fought valiantly to fight the ferocious fires that tore through their valley. Anthony is father was killed but he, his mother, brother and family friend all miraculously survived. Anthony and his father's livelihood were their orchards which were all lost in the fires along with their homes and all that they had. Anthony's family were well known for their faith in their local community and beyond. What happens to your faith when you go through something like that? Anthony will share how God has been with them.

<u>Confirmation Service</u> – 9.00 am, 22 August 2010. Seven people will be confirmed. It is some years since we have had a Confirmation Service. It would be good to have the church filled to overflowing for this occasion.

 5^{th} Sunday – 29 August 2010 – One combined service at 10.00 am that day. Guest preacher – Professor Howard Wallace, Lecturer in Old Testament at the Uniting Church Centre for Theology & Mission, Melbourne.

<u>Fresh Expressions</u> is an exciting joint venture of the Anglican and Methodist churches in the UK. It aims to encourage new forms of church for a fast changing world, working with Christians from a variety of denominations and traditions. Alanee will be looking at this venture on her forthcoming study leave in the UK. Greg is intending to introduce the congregation to ideas from *Fresh Expressions* soon. <u>Advent</u> – The Ministry Team is exploring a series of creative ways to get the message of Advent across to members of the congregation and others. Stay tuned! Christmas Alight will be part of our Advent celebrations again this year, using the 2009 model – i.e., two morning sessions between Term 4 break-up and Christmas. Belinda Chung and Gail Irvine will co-ordinate this again.

<u>Seminars</u> – Brian Clarkson has attended a conference on revisiting the Basis of Union and Peter Baker, Neil Graham and Ross Mackinnon attended an evening presentation on music and spirituality at the John Garratt Bookroom, Mulgrave recently. Talk to any of these people about what they have learnt.

<u>Something to read</u> – Mark Sayers' book *The Trouble with Paris: Following Jesus in a World of Plastic Promise*". In this book, Mark Sayers shows us how the lifestyles of most young adults (19-35) actually work against a life of meaning and happiness to sabotage their faith. Sayers shows how a fresh understanding of God's intention for our world is the true path to happiness, fulfillment, and meaning.

Outreach Missional Group Report - August 2010

At our latest Outreach Missional Group committee meeting we had the pleasure of inviting Fay Schroeter to give us a presentation about her community outreach project, the Baby Baskets. Fay is highly dedicated to the task of donating Baby Baskets to struggling single mothers and their newborn babies. Each basket contains a wide range of baby items such as clothes, hygiene products, blankets, toys and books, all of which give both mother and child extra support. An incredible amount of love and care goes into all of the baskets, which are created and distributed to mothers who are in the greatest need.

The mission group that went to Kenya last Christmas holidays have worked hard to create a stunning book 'Africa 2009-2010', about their experiences in Africa. Included within it are gorgeous pictures of their trip as they served the children in the orphanage and the rural families in the wider community. Each member of the mission team has offered different stories and reflections from their trip, which proves to make this book quite a challenging, heart-wrenching and inspiring read. Each book is \$20 and all proceeds go directly to Mission In Action, the orphanage that they volunteered at.

A series of lovely noticeboards are now hanging on the wall along the walkway at the side of the fellowship area. One of these boards is dedicated to the Outreach Missional Group and displays information in regards to different projects that are currently active in our community. These include initiatives that individuals have taken on as well as projects that are being coordinated by larger groups. In such a large community as GWUC it is sometimes difficult to keep track of all the exciting things that people are doing in the world. By exhibiting the different things that go on, we hope that this board will improve and facilitate communication throughout the church and will promote the good things that people are involved in. At present you can visit the display and read all about the different COP projects for 2010 that will be funded by the profits of our upcoming fete.
