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#### GWUC Parking - 500 does not go into 38

We have a beautiful set of buildings and manses, in a high profile, prime retail location of Glen Waverley. Our building facilities are highly sort after by our members and many other hirers who use the complex.

Around 4,000 people come into our buildings every month, and we have only 38 available parking spaces. More than 38 members of our congregation alone have disabled parking stickers, and we have only 2 designated parking bays.

So, no amount of mathematical analysis and reallocation can or will ever solve this dilemma.

Despite anecdotal evidence congestion is not caused by casual shop parkers, as just as many GWUC members park and go down the street for coffee. This occurs every Sunday morning as well!

There is only one solution - Common sense.

Throughout the week we have many, many groups, hirers, elderly, young children, mobility limited and mature age people needing and wanting access to the complex car park. Church Council and Property Committee have discussed this matter at length and believe that every person who uses this complex is important. Therefore no-one has a priority call on these limited facilities.

So we are asking for you to show common sense and consideration If you need to use the car park, then please do so. If you do not really need it, please park in alternative locations so others who do need it can gain access. This applies to everyone.

Hirers are being contacted and reminded that their Hire agreement do NOT entitle them to parking, and this will be written into the Agreements for 2012 onwards.

So your help will make the use of the complex easier for everyone.

#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Did you know that Kaye and Rose Morgan are off to Jembrana, Indonesia with Habitat from the 18 June - 2 July to help build houses for the community there? Well done (young and enthusiastic) ladies. We want to hear your stories on return.

Don't forget Habitat's next "Brush with Kindness Bushfire Response" day, 4 June at Redesdale. If you can assist please advise Lyn McDonald ASAP. We plan to carpool as usual.

#### **PLAYGROUPS**

Our Playgroups are amazing. In a little over 12 months the clientele has built up to approx 50 children each week, across the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday sessions. Many of the families have recently arrived from overseas and many found the Playgroups on the GWUC website before they arrived here.

Kaye Mackinnon, who is run off her feet managing the three groups, says there is enough interest to start a Thursday Group. However Kaye needs another committed hostess currently and yet another IF we were to start a new group. **Committed** = prepared to lead a group each week, love children and is keen to interact with the newly arrived families and help with their various questions, "How do I...?" "Where can I..?" "What do I have to ...?"

Talk to Kaye Mackinnon 9560 4746 if you consider you may be able to assist. This is real OUTREACH.

#### FLOOD RELIEF - CHARLTON

It's interesting to reflect on Habitat's "Brush with Kindness Bushfire Response" program which is still continuing nearly 2½ years after the January 2009 fires. There are a lot of parallels with those people throughout Australia who have suffered from the recent floods. These latter people will be hurting for many years and particularly those who are not getting a payout from their Insurance Company, whilst neighbours will get a payout. Imagine the angst and hurt building up in the community! Many of the folk in Charlton are retired and pensioners and have no way of building up their life savings again.

The 23 flannelette sheet sets we sent up to Charlton with Don Cormack last Saturday have been received and are being distributed. "Our man" Dennis in Charlton said,

Please pass on to your congregation a huge thankyou also for the ongoing involvement in this trauma... it still has a long way to go and all help is certainly appreciated. I feel some people are more pleased than you'd think. It's just the overwhelming situation they find themselves in and how hard it is to get back up. I'm sure Don will have much to convey when he returns from the battle lines. Once again thankyou from the people you are helping ..".

Don is doing building work – something he's well experienced in and does well - for some of the folk in Charlton (who aren't getting an insurance payout). Talk to him when he gets back to hear his stories. It's \$70 worth of petrol each way to Charlton!

I've asked Dennis what else he needs financial assistance for as we still have some money in our Flood Relief "kitty" due to the generosity both of GWUC folk and those others who know of this work. I am well aware that donations are currently required in so many areas of Outreach however whilst our donations to Charlton are still helping "our neighbours" there I'll continue to tell you about the need and responses we receive from Dennis on behalf of those being helped.
