Mennonites Persecuted in Vletnam

On 9 June, the students of a Mennonite Bible School in South Vietnam were woken by 300 plain-clothe police at 11pm for an 'administrative search'. The 76 Christians present were brutally assaulted and detained overnight. Twenty students needed medical attention. The same happened the following three nights. This is to intimidate a church group whose leader, Rev Nguyen Hong Quang, is an outspoken advocate for religious freedom. Raids and persecution have continued, utilities have been cut off and phones and motorbikes confiscated. Fifty-two students and leaders, including Pastor Quang, were summoned to be interrogated. On 12 June the Mennonite leaders protested officially about the abuse. A nearby Catholic church has agreed to provide refuge for Mennonite victims of persecution if needed. May the Lord protect and preserve them all.

A Test for India in Chhattisgarh

Since mid-May over 50 villages in Chhattisgarh's Bastar region have followed the advice of the Hindu nationalist VHP and used the Chhattisgarh Panchayat Raj Act to ban all non-Hindu religious practice. As Christian leaders note, these rulings are contrary to the Indian Constitution.

Despite this, the VHP has said it will lobby the authorities to ensure the bans are imposed. Persecution has escalated, with numerous reports of violence and social boycotts whereby Christians are being denied access to water and food rations. The Chhattisgarh Christian Forum has requested that the Panchayat Raj Act (which facilitates rural selfgovernment) be scrapped and is threatening to take the authorities to court if they do not act. They fear that persecution could escalate into anti-Christian pogroms. Please pray for India and its Church.

What is Growing Faith - Reaching Community?

October is the month of **Growing Faith** - **Reaching Community** which is the theme for this year's Growing Generous Givers program. A task group is working hard to offer an opportunity for everyone to be involved and contributing to the life of the Glen Waverley Uniting Church.

At its recent meeting the Congregation received the Church Council Organic Vision Document. While this vision document is still being considered by the congregation, it proposes four different areas of ministry to focus on in the coming years. The document was put together from the responses achieved from the open forum meetings and after prayer and discernment.

The congregation will continue its present ministry activities and at the same time, if endorsed, will grow these four areas:

- Continuing to build connectedness and genuine community (includes pastoral care fellowship).
- Nurturing faith development, sharing, questioning and exploration.
- Kingsway Ministry. This involves intentionally growing our ministry to our local multicultural community.
- Raising Glen Waverley Uniting Church's profile, by serving our local community. (This involves developing partnerships where possible.)

Growing Faith - **Reaching Community** is not just about raising money. The Task Group want to encourage members to be praying for the ministry and mission of our congregation. We want to encourage members to think about their talents, time availability and passions and get involved in the life of the congregation. Congregation members will also be encouraged to consider before God their giving to the church. The church wants to be able to resource its current ministry, and grow that ministry in terms of our agreed future direction.

The program will run over the first three Sundays in October.
