Storm Clouds Gather Over Libya

It appears likely that Libya's newly formed UN-backed Government of National Accord (GNA) will invite Western powers to launch an anti-IS military intervention in Libya. However, the GNA is rejected by both the Islamist government in Tripoli and the anti-Islamist government in Tobruk. Meanwhile, Libya's Islamic jihadists have united with the aim of capturing the oil fields and launching jihad into Egypt and across North Africa, as well as into Italy and across Europe - hence the likelihood that Libya will soon be aflame. The threat to the remnant Libyan Church is extreme. If the jihadists succeed, the threat will spread explosively. Egypt's indigenous Christian Copts also would be gravely imperilled, as would the vulnerable, largely Berber Church in Tunisia and Algeria. Please pray for God to intervene in Libya.

Blasphemy Law in Pakistan used to Attack Christians

On 19 April Imran Masih (28), an illiterate Christian janitor living in Chak 44 in Punjab's Mandi Bahauddin District, was accused of blasphemy. Though Imran has fled, the Muslims of Chak 44 are demanding that the Christians deliver him up so they can burn him alive. Otherwise, the Christians must convert to Islam or leave the village. The local mosques have organised a boycott of the village's 45 Christian families, leaving them without food, water or work. Convinced the blasphemy accusation is false, the police have refused to register a case against Imran. On 6 May they prevented an organised mob from burning down Christians' homes. Tensions are soaring; the situation is volatile. Please pray for Imran. Pray for Pakistan and may its Christians know liberty, security and justice.

A Letter to the Congregation

Dear Friends,

Over the coming months Church Councillors are undertaking six studies titled 'Leaders in God's Mission'. The Study guide has been created by Rev Dr Robert Bos and the purpose of these studies is to help Church Councillors focus on the essentials in exercising leadership in God's mission. Robert Bos believes that if we focus on what is central to the purpose of the church we will find ourselves 'caught up in God's life-transforming mission to God's creation'. Through the process we discover ourselves renewed in faith and hope. Church Councillors will take quiet time between each meeting to read, pray, reflect and discuss the studies.

Recently Alanee and I attended the Uniting Womens Conference in Adelaide. The focus was on sharing stories of hope. Dr Liz Boase presented a reflection on Exodus 1:8-22 which centred on the idea that in choosing hope over fear and oppression we choose to foster life. The women who presented their stories spoke of how throughout their lives they were confronted with situations that demanded a complete trust in the Holy Spirit. They had the choice to be shattered or they could choose to respond with courage, determination and wisdom. What they shared was an understanding that if we truly believe that we are on a faith journey with Christ then we can be assured that we are not travelling alone.
