Copts Seek Justice as Violence escalates in Egypt: Violence by Muslims against Egypt's indigenous Christian Copts is escalating. Police are reluctant to intervene against mob violence and perpetrators know they are guaranteed impunity. Once the damage is done, the Cops are ordered into 'reconciliation sessions' where the Muslims agree to end the violence in exchange for Christian guarantees that charges will be dropped. Now the Coptic Bishophric of Samalout city is taking a stand, insisting that reconciliation cannot occur before the rule of law is applied. How Muslims respond to this courageous and principled - albeit risky - stand remains to be seen. Meanwhile, Islamic State has claimed responsibility for the 30 June assassination of a Coptic priest in al-Arish, northern Sinai, saying Father Moussa (46) was killed for 'combating Islam'. Please pray for Egypt and its Church.

Christians face elevated threat in Turkey: The coup attempt of 15-16 July, along with the 'people's counter-coup' that put it down, has fuelled a dramatic escalation in conservative Islamic zeal and Islamo-Turkic nationalism. The threat facing non-Sunni Muslims and non-Muslims (Armenian, Assyrian and Greek Christians and Muslim converts) is now greatly elevated. Furthermore, the failed coup has empowered President Erdogan (a conservative Islamist) and provided him an opportunity to eliminate his opponents, tighten his grip on power, advance his personality cult and even further his dangerous Islamo-Turkic nationalism. The threat facing those suspected of being 'enemies of the state' - ie. Gulenists, Kemalists/secularists, non-Turks, non-Muslims - is now greatly heightened. The threat facing Turkey's Christians may be greater now than at any time since Kemal Ataturk abolished the Caliphate in 1924. Please pray for Turkey and its Church.
