#### The Christian Church in the World

#### 'Remember those in prison' in Algeria, Iran and Sudan

On 7 August an Algerian judge sentenced Slimane Bouhafs to five years imprisonment for blaspheming in a social media post claiming that the light of Jesus was overcoming the 'lie' of Islam. In Iran, where many Christians are imprisoned, three Azerbaijanis and an Iranian convert were arrested at an engagement party in Tehran on 24 June and 11 believers were arrested in a raid on a house church on 12 August. In Sudan, two Nuba pastors, a Darfuri convert and a Czech film-maker are on trial, accused of tarnishing the government's image with 'false' stories of Christian persecution and Nuba genocide. The charges include waging war against the state and espionage, which carry the death penalty. 'Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them...' (Hebrews 13:3)

#### Christians in Pakistan - 'Persecuted, but not forsaken' (2 Cor 4:9)

Early on Friday 2 September four Islamic militants attacked the Warsak Dam Christian Colony with the intention of wiping out the 30-40 Christian families living there. First they shot and killed Samuel Masih as he unlocked the gates at 5.30am. Fortunately someone managed to call the police. They happened to be close by and on high alert, having been informed that terrorists were planning to attack the nearby Warsak Military Cadet College. All four terrorists were killed, though miraculously no other Christians perished, despite one terrorist detonating his explosive vest inside a Christian family's house. May Jesus our Saviour and Shepherd comfort and support Samuel Masih's widow and five children. May Yahweh Sabaoth, the Lord of hosts, command his angels (Psalm 91) to guard and defend Pakistan's vulnerable Christian communities.

#### **Eco Task Group**

Have you heard of the 5-leaf eco-awards programme? It is an ecumenical initiative that encourages churches and their congregations to take practical action to make us better stewards for our environment. (For more information see https://fiveleafecoawards.org.) Church council has endorsed an eco-task group comprising Amy Spark Eichenbaum, Aaron Blakemore, David Morgan and John Snare, to explore options to achieve Five Leaf Eco-Award certification. Of course. certification is not an end in itself, but the discipline of the programme has the potential to help us find practical ways, both in our church and private lives, to be better stewards of our precious environment. You will be aware that we have already done a lot as a church to be more eco-friendly. Our water harvesting and reuse followed by our solar electricity installations are examples of what has been done to date. There are others in our Presbytery interested in the 5-leaf eco-awards programme, and together we are looking at options. As a first step, we have recently completed an energy use audit so that we have baseline information against which to measure progress. The audit revealed that last year we generated more electricity than we used. Our solar panels are saving us money and also contributing to easing the pressure on the environment. We are so lucky to be such a resource rich congregation. However, it is important to balance the effort we put into protecting the environment with requirements to resource other aspects of our mission, and eco-initiatives will be proposed mindful of that. Eco Tip: All plastic bags/ plastic that can be scrunched up can be recycled at Coles stores and some Woolworths stores where they have plastic bag recycling. So all the plastic bags that food etc. are bought in can be collected and taken back to the supermarket for recycling.

This month we are holding another exciting outreach forum.



# Faith-filled friendships essential ingredient for breaking down Islamophobia

A Pastoral Statement from the Rev Sharon Hollis, Moderator of the Uniting Church Synod of Victoria and Tasmania

As Interfaith September draws to a close, I want to encourage people of all faiths and none to remember there are eleven other months in which we can also celebrate the strengths of interfaith dialogue and relationship.

The need to walk together is imperative as new data from a university research project tracking attitudes to Islam has found that people who do not actually know any Muslims are more convinced that they pose a threat.

This is as unsurprising as it is alarming.

The Uniting Church has a strong commitment to an interfaith community and I would urge all members to make connections with Muslim neighbours and colleagues, and to seek out multi-faith groups so together we can break down this growing fear of 'the other'.

Some members of Federal Parliament and sections of the media are fuelling this fear, by utilising the complexities of our world to make uninformed provocative statements. As Christians we are called to stand with all who experience discrimination and exclusion. We are also called to address this fear and ignorance with knowledge and respect.

We believe that as a nation we are capable of being inclusive and of protecting and supporting those who experience vilification and alienation. We are capable of being wiser and stronger when we open ourselves to the gift of the other.

As people of faith we believe that the vibrant interfaith community is comfortable living and working in a secular environment where people of all faith or none are welcomed. We seek what we know we have in common. We have come to know that there is nothing to fear from diversity. We welcome the stranger to share a place at the table and in this way we become friends.

I encourage all Victorians and Tasmanians to build on these qualities of welcome, hospitality and openness of mind and heart so that together we build a rich, diverse and generous nation.
