The Christian Church in the World

Oppression - and a Win - for the Church in Russia:

On 5 September a St Petersburg court found Archbishop Zhuravlev of the Reformed Orthodox Church of Christ the Saviour guilty of illegal missionary activity; he was fined. On 10 September two Americans were arrested for worshipping at Kaluga's Word of Life Pentecostal church; they were fined but not deported. On 17 September police arrested participants at a Pentecostal youth conference in Samara; all were later released. On 23 September, in a win for common sense and justice, a district court in Orenburg Province decided in favour of Pastor Demkin of the Church of Evangelical Christians-Baptists (EKhB), rejecting the ridiculous charges brought against him by the prosecutor's office. As had quickly become evident, the Baptist church's summer programs for children have overwhelming community support. Please pray for Russia and its Christians.

New Regulations Herald Dark Days for China's Church:

On 8 September China's ruling Communist Party (CCP) released a draft of new 'Regulations on Religious Affairs'. Friday 7 October was the final day for public comment before the law would come into effect. The regulations give the CCP total control over religions nation-wide, purportedly on national security grounds. Unregistered religious activity will no longer be tolerated, registered churches will be heavily restricted and all building will be tightly regulated. Furthermore, when the Ministry of Justice's amended 'Administrative Measures for Law Firms' come into effect on 1 November, China's lawyers will be banned from speaking publicly about human rights abuses. So not only will the Church be without freedom, it is destined to be without lawyers to advocate for it. May God intervene in China and build his Church.

Monthly Material Aid Offering to support Welfare Committee

On behalf of Glen Waverley Uniting Church, and through your generosity, the Welfare Committee is able to provide practical, spiritual and emotional support to those in our church and in the wider community who seek our assistance.

Primarily our focus is on day to day living expenses and the general independent functioning of individuals and families.

Following an assessment, we are able to provide Supermarket Vouchers (subsidised through UCA's Share Program) together with food donations we receive from the congregation. Those we see are encouraged to access existing community resources including those within our church.

You are respectfully reminded that Sunday 13 November has been allocated as 'Material Aid Offering' day with this month's focus on the work of the Welfare Committee.

Non-perishables such as breakfast cereals, long life milk, canned fruit, soups, meals etc; tea, coffee, Milo, biscuits etc are all appreciated as well as toothpaste and brushes, soap, washing powders.

Cleaning and Lawn Mowing Rosters 2017

We are currently preparing the cleaning and mowing rosters for 2017.

Church cleaning and lawn mowing are carried out by volunteers. Four teams of 2 people clean a part of the complex each week and mow lawns as required by the season, taking no more than 2 hours.

Unfortunately our ageing group of volunteers continues to be depleted and the number of duties per person will need to increase beyond 4 a year unless we gain some new recruits.

If you are among the younger members of the congregation (under 70!) please consider whether you could give a couple of hours sometime on a Friday evening or Saturday morning 4 times a year in 2017 to help keep our church tidy.
