## **Eco Task Group Report - Outreach Forum on Climate Change**

Last November we were fortunate to have David Karoly talk to an outreach forum on the topic of climate change and the environment. Omitting the post-truth perspective, the evidence is now clear that manmade climate change is affecting us now, and has the potential to cause dramatic changes to our world unless we collectively take action. There is no point in debating that any longer, but there is a reasonable and sensible debate to be had about what actions and priorities should be followed. David's presentation challenged us to think about this from the perspective of the values we hold, and to look for courses of action that provide benefits simultaneously to our community, our economy, the environment and perhaps ourselves. As Christians we know full-well that despite many of the problems in life appearing overwhelming, we can individually make a difference by the things that we do and control. Maybe we can be more thoughtful and careful about how we use energy, maybe we can express our concerns to those who develop public policy in government, and the list goes on.

ECO-TIP: Did you know that all those disposable batteries that populate the gadgets in our home can be recycled? The City of Monash has a battery recycling facility at its waste collection point in Ferntree Gully Road, near Blackburn Road (380 Ferntree Gully Rd, Notting Hill). There is no charge for dropping off batteries. Why not collect them in a box or bag and every now and again drop them off for recycling? (Please be careful that you don't allow connections of batteries to be shorted-out and please keep button cells away from the reach of young children.) The batteries used in the church sound systems are collected for recycling, and you can do the same.

Batteries can also be placed in a bin at the Council offices near the church.

#### One Million Stars to End Violence ...



... is a love and peace filled community project. These beautiful stars are symbols of light, courage and solidarity to end all forms of violence, including violence against women, bullying and racism.

The One Million Stars project began in Brunswick Victoria, 2012 as a personal response to the rape and murder of a local woman. Since then it has grown into an international weaving movement with stars being woven by communities in Australia, New

Zealand, the Pacific Islands, Europe and the USA. Some of these stars have been part of stunning displays at the Royal Exhibition Building Melbourne, Queen St Mall Brisbane (G20), Myer Melbourne and the Sydney Opera House.

The One Million Stars project is an opportunity for us to be light and hope in the world and to make something beautiful and powerful together. We know that domestic violence, violence on our streets, racism and harassment is happening right now and often it is difficult to know what to do to help those who are suffering and to help prevent it.

The One Million Stars project is an opportunity to remind each other that we can do something about it and not feel paralysed by all that is broken with humanity.

The short term goal is to weave one million stars for an installation during the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018). The long term goal is to be light and courage for each other and not act violently with our words and actions, but with passion and generosity.

Every woven star reminds us that we have to make peace and safe spaces and that it doesn't just happen. Every star is a commitment to resist violence and revenge, to believe in forgiveness and healing.
