A Letter to the Congregation

Dear Friends,

Within the Christian calendar there are different seasons. These can be regarded as 'time gifts' for Christians. At Christmas we celebrate the birth of Christ. At Easter we celebrate the resurrection and at Pentecost the focus is on the giving of the Holy Spirit.

Lent is a sacred time to consider our lives and especially become centred on our discipleship to Christ. The Lenten season provides us with an opportunity to draw close to God. We could accept the gift of time and create a quiet place to experience the closeness of God. By inviting God into this quiet space we could truly experience what the Lenten season offers. We could quietly feel the presence of the Divine in what happens in our everyday life.

Pausing each day during Lent means intentionally committing to carving out time to do so. Put life on hold for just a few moments. Consider the circumstances that led up to the crucifixion of Jesus and the resurrection. Mark chronicled Jesus's last week on a day to day basis and it is of extraordinary importance for Christians. It is revelatory. Mark writes it simply:

'You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth who was crucified: He has been raised.'

Desmond Tutu writes 'Each of us wants and needs to give ourselves space for quiet for it is in the stillness we come to know what our hearts long for: the Divine Presence alive in us.'

Holy Spirit, keep us firm in the reality of the freedom Christ has won for us.

Our next Inclusive Community Meeting will be held on Thursday 20 April at 2.30pm in Room 1. If you have suggestions for activities, please let us know.




This film presents the campaign for a fair go for East Timor and that nation's desire to settle it's long running boundary dispute with Australia.

We are invited to support the people of West Papua and to pray with them.

Jacob Rumbiak, the Foreign Affairs Minister of the Federal Republic of West Papua who resides in Melbourne, is currently visiting East Africa. The purpose of the trip is to engage the East Africa block of nations (Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Burundi, Rwanda) into supporting the Pacific Coalition for West Papua's quest to have West Papua reinserted on the UN Decolonisation List at the next General Assembly. Meetings have been arranged by African supporters with the Presidents of the five nations.
