

The Christian Church in the World - July

Nearly 100 Christians arrested in Eritrea

World Watch Monitor reports ten Christians were arrested on 9 May at a home in Ginda, having been betrayed by neighbours. On 17 May some 35 Christians were arrested from their homes, after a compulsory survey exposed them as evangelicals. Forty-nine Christians were arrested on 21 May at a post-wedding celebration outside Asmara. Since May 2002 thousands of Christians have suffered incarceration, hundreds have been severely tortured and at least 28 have died in custody due to mistreatment. Christians attempting to flee routinely fall prey to human traffickers. Eritrean Orthodox Patriarch Abune Antonios (89) has been confined to house-arrest for more than ten years; he had protested the persecution of "Medhane Alem", a thriving revival movement which exists within the Eritrean Orthodox Church. Please pray for Eritrea and its Church.

In Iran, people want change

There was a high turn-out to the Iranian elections on 19 May when the incumbent, President Hassan Rouhani, was comfortably re-elected. Most significantly, Rouhani won despite his opponent, hard-liner Ebrahim Raisi, being the regime's preferred candidate. Hard-liners only ever won when reform-minded Iranians boycotted elections. But those days are over; the people are making their will known. However, nothing can change while Iran's unelected powers - the supreme leader Ayatollah Khamenei and his Revolutionary Guards - retain ultimate power. Human rights abuses, including persecution of Christians, will continue and may even be exacerbated by US President Trump's overt support for, and enormous arms deal with, the Wahhabist, anti-Shi'ite, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. (Like Iran, Saudi Arabia is a leading sponsor of international terorism). May God intervene to the blessing of his church.

A Letter to the Congregation - July

Dear Friends,

Each month Church Council meet to focus on developing the vision. Two aspects which were discussed at the June Church Council meeting were intercultural ministry and pastoral care.

Early in 2017 the Church Council agreed to a request from a small Indonesian fellowship to hold fortnightly services in the church chapel (room 1) on Sunday afternoons. The request was for a three month trial and the group expressed the desire to work towards becoming members of Glen Waverley Uniting Church. Some members of the group already are members of this congregation. This group of 15-18 people had a history with the Uniting Church and wanted to integrate with our congregation. The trial was approved and mentioned at the February congregational meeting. Some members of our congregation have attended services. Neil has supported the group and preached on three occasions. Sometimes the service is in Indonesian and sometimes in Indonesian and English. The trial has been successful and the small fellowship and the church council have resolved to facilitate the integration of this small group into the life of Glen Waverley Uniting Church. This is a gentle but significant way to grow our intercultural ministry in line with our vision.

Another aspect of our vision is pastoral care and Di Paterson's hours of work have been increased to further support members of our Congregation. Di is thoroughly enjoying her role and has been joining in as many activities as possible so people get to know her.

The vision continues to provide us with a sense of direction and we continue to accept the challenge to reach out, dream and imagine possibilities.

NextGen to South Korea - Contextual Learning

Please see below a message from Swee Ann Koh (Director of the Intercultural Unit, Commission for Mission.

You may remember that in 2015 the Intercultural Unit of the Uniting Church took 19 young people from 15 diverse ethnic and cultural backgrounds to China. There the group connected with Chinese Christians for a contextual learning program. Glen Waverley Uniting Church supported the program. It was a very successful journey, and now it is proposed to conduct a similar learning journey in South Korea from 26 October to 6 November 2017.

Contextual learning is about mutual relationship and respect. It encourages each other to learn about the partner's ministry context in order to discern God's mission in and between groups of people.

This 2017 journey will be a joint program between:-

- the Presbyterian Church of Korea the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea the Korean Methodist Church, and
- the Intercultural Unit, Commission for Mission.

The program will enable NextGen young people to connect and learn from those in South Korean Christian churches. They will have the opportunity to share with the rapidly growing Church in South Korea the multicultural nature of the Uniting Church and their faith journeys. Upon their return the NextGen group will share with the Synod what they observed and learned.

Each young person accepted into the program (a maximum of 20) will travel to South Korea with the group on the given dates, visiting two cities (Seoul and Pusan). They will meet with young Korean people from various Christian congregations for discussions, participation in workshops, worship, and to enjoy their hospitality. The group will also learn about the Korean churches' mission outreach projects. The group will be accompanied by five adult leaders from Australia who will provide pastoral support and opportunities for debriefing. This is a great opportunity to add capacity and develop leadership skills for the NextGen within our Synod. NextGen to South Korea ... cont.
