Material Aid Offering - Sunday 10 September

The September Material Aid Offering will be in support of the Glen Waverley Uniting Church Welfare Committee. The Welfare team regularly have people coming to the church for assistance with food, medication, transport and assistance to find housing. The material aid offering is for non-perishables such as breakfast cereals, long life milk, Milo, canned fruit, soups, meals etc. As well as tea, coffee, biscuits, toothpaste and brushes, soap and washing powders. The Welfare work of our church makes a real difference in people's lives.

Changes to our Carpark and Disabled Parking Spaces

To enable better and safer access to our buildings **for all users**, and to provide more mixed parking capabilities in our vary limited parking area, we are making the following changes to the car park. Please observe any signage changes and take note of the following specific details:-

- The current **Office Manager** space at the top will be narrowed and converted into a Motorbike and Push Bike (with rack) **ONLY** space. It will not be big enough for any size vehicle, so please do not try to park there, as you will damage your car. Signage will be updated accordingly.
- The current **Ministry Team** space will be relocated to the top of the south side area next to the tank fence, and the existing space will be moved towards the new Bike space and become the **Office Manager** only space.
- The two **Disabled** spaces will be slightly moved and both **widened**.
- The ramp will be moved and the access area between the **Disabled** spaces will be widened to dissuade people blocking the ramp and to ensure the safe passage of persons with special needs, walkers and scooters on to the ramp.

People wishing to use the **Disabled** spaces **MUST** display a current, valid, authorised sticker **in their name** at all times, OR they must be transporting a valid voucher owner **at the time they park in that space**. Cars found parked in those disabled spaces without the conditions of the disabled voucher being met will be advised to the Monash City Council who issue the vouchers and control the conditions of use.

We have tried the commonsense, fair and reasonable approach, but unfortunately not everyone has shown those same attributes.

We will be circulating these changes in English and Chinese to all church groups and hirers.

Church Council Report

Church Council met this week, with the newly elected members. The meeting decided it would not be appropriate to appoint the new members to leadership positions until they had some time to become familiar with church council processes and responsibilities, and for members of council to become more familiar with each other, and hence better able to discern who among them would make the best chair. Only a few members are continuing, and none of them were willing to be chair. Because of this situation, the meeting decided to co-opt Helen Stewart, the previous chair of council who did not stand for re-election, and ask her to act as transitional chair for the rest of this year. Council has in recent years elected new office bearers at the beginning of each calendar year. David Morgan was elected secretary, with assistance from Gael O'Brien and David Fraser, especially when David Morgan's travelling.

Much of the meeting was taken up with familiarising new members with the responsibilities and processes of council. This will be an ongoing process, in which the new members will be supported by the continuing members and the retiring office bearers.

Applications are currently being received for the Community Planter position approved by the Congregation last December. This is seen as an essential step in our strategy of engaging with, and better reflecting, the ethnic mix of our community.

We were pleased to agree to the baptism of John Snare's grand-daughter Eleanor from Perth.

Rev Neil Peters reported on the conference that he and Alanee attended in Adelaide last week, with highlights including a session on healthy team cultures, with applications to ministry team, Church Council, and the congregation.

Safe Church Training

We need to be able to assure the parents of children in our midst that we have done everything practicable to ensure the safety of their children, for theological, ethical, legal and practical reasons. The recent Royal Commission has demonstrated that our past efforts and processes have not been adequate.

State government and the UCA have responded with new requirements, and it is important that the congregation become familiar with these. In particular, all members who might be seen by a child as persons of authority need to have a Working with Children Check, and training on child protection every two years.

Protection of other vulnerable groups is also important. For this reason we will be presenting a Safe Church training session prepared by the Synod on the following dates:

Wednesday September 6 at 7.30pm Friday September 8 at 2.30pm Sunday September 10 at 2.30pm
