The Christian Church in the World

Continuing deterioration of religious freedom in Russia

Although Russia was officially Christian for over 1000 years, some Protestant groups were considered 'dangerous sects' and were severely persecuted by the State in the 19th Century. After the Russian Revolution in 1917, atheism was propagated, all religions were persecuted and many church leaders were martyred or spent decades in labour camps. After the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991, there was a short period of religious freedom and a spiritual revival across its former republics. Many people accepted Christ. However, Protestant Churches experienced restrictions on their outreach. In 1997, further restrictions resulted in religious freedom worsening. A package of Kremlin counter-terrorism measures enacted in July 2016 included prohibition of any outreach activity outside church premises. This particularly affects three million Protestant Christians. Please pray for Russia and its Church.

In China, Christian advocate confined in an "infinite darkness"

When Gao Zhisheng, committed Christian human rights attorney and religious liberty advocate, emerged from three years' secret detention in August 2014, many surmised he was "utterly destroyed". Confined to house arrest and denied access to medical care, Gao (who had survived torture) could have withered and died, but he did not - he recovered. Despite intensive supervision, Gao wrote both a memoir and a 40-page report on human rights in China. These secret writings were smuggled out and have since been published. On 13 August Gao "disappeared". Recently Gao's supporters have discovered that he is being held in a secret prison in Shaanxi Province, in solitary confinement, in total darkness and denied access to medical care. They fear for his life. Please pray for Gao and for China and its church.

My name is Dietrich Cheung. From 2017 I'll be working part-time at Glen Waverley Uniting Church as the "Community Planter". My main focus is working in 'cross-cultural' ministry within the local area of Glen Waverley; but you also will see me floating around doing a range of things within the Church community. Previously I worked in sales and marketing, business development and management and completed my business studies at RMIT in 2010. I then discerned a call from God to ministry with a strong passion for counselling and pastoral care leading me to complete my Masters of Divinity at the end of 2017. Recently, however, God has led me to work in youth ministry and in particular cross-cultural ministry and

mission. I still have a long way to go in my own spiritual journey – but God has been super gracious to me all the way thus far!

My main focus however will be spending lots of time with people from a Chinese background- trying to know them and their needs. Many are "unchurched" and have no previous experience in any Church community. As you may know already, the demographics surrounding the area of GWUC in the recent years is represented strongly by migrant communities (Chinese, Korean, Malaysian, Singaporean, Indonesian etc.)

We've been blessed with a great opportunity to do 'mission' within our own backyards! We just need the leadership and creativity of a strong team to build this ministry together. Thus, I envision the ministry of our Church being that 'middle' space where a lot of these people can find an even deeper connection within our existing faith community. Hopefully, in time many will come to learn about us and what we offer to them.

It would be my passion and mission to continue to serve Him through this new and exciting ministry to our local community. Come and say hi and ask me more about how we can partner together in our 'local mission' to our neighbours!

I look forward to serving alongside, fellowshipping with and getting to know all of you better!
