Bill has a great interest in the church and a caring concern for the future of the church.

Rev Neil Peters has invited Bill to preach at the 11 am service at Glen Waverley on Sunday 18th November where Neil and Bill will jointly preside at Holy Communion.

Celebrating Ordination Milestones

At the 10am service on Sunday 2 December we will have the opportunity to acknowledge 50 years of ordination for Rev Evan Laidlaw. Over 50 years Evan's preaching, leadership of worship, pastoral care, Bible study and community engagement have touched thousands of lives. At the service we will hear some brief reflections from Evan and we will give thanks to God for 50 years of ordination and his long service in ministry.

Also, at the same service, we will mark 25 years of ordination for Rev Neil Peters.

The Christian Church in the World

Pressure on Church mounting in China: The ruling Chinese Communist Party (CCP) is working to rein in the Church. Unregistered fellowships are being forcibly closed. In China's north-west Gansu Province, summer camps have been closed down and Catholic priests dismissed. In Henan Province churches have been raided, believers arrested and Christians forced to sign letters of commitment, promising not to join Christianity but to follow the CCP. In Beijing, the city's seven largest house churches have been forced to relocate, a process the authorities hope will result in closures. Across the country, churches are being forced to take down their crosses and replace them with Chinese flags. Some churches have been forced to sing nationalistic songs during services and display images of Chinese President Xi Jinping. Please pray for China and its Church.

In India, 271 Christians face criminal charges: On 5 September police in Uttar Pradesh, indicted 271 members of the 7000-member church in Bhulandih Village. The charge was that the Christians go out after Sunday and Tuesday prayers and spread misinformation about Hinduism while luring people to become Christian through fraudulent and even criminal means. This allegation was made by a Hindu nationalist group that works to prevent conversions to Christianity and Islam while facilitating "re-conversions" to Hinduism. A subsequent police investigation found no evidence of fraudulent conversions. However, after weeks of pressure from Hindu nationalists, which included constant violent harassment of the church, a court ordered the charge to proceed. The believers therefore remain accused of procuring conversion by fraudulent means and hurting religious feelings under India's Criminal Code. Please pray for India and its Christians.

From Glyn Howells, Chair of Church Council

Long Term Planning: Council has begun a process for longer term planning, particularly in terms of ministerial staff. As a first step members of Church Council and the congregation (in pairs) will seek feedback from missional (eg: the Inclusive Community Missional Group), functional (eg: Property Committee) and fellowship groups about their current activities, focussing on what is life-giving and their dreams for the future. The results will be brought to January Church Council. Options will then be drawn up before having an intensive (one or two day?) retreat to work through emerging challenges and possibilities. In the process, with your help, we will also examine our current vision document and check that it remains on track.

Acknowledgement of First Peoples: After approaches to Council by a number of congregation members, Council have been discussing how to acknowledge Australia's First Peoples.

As a consequence, at the Congregational meeting on 20 November, Church Council is seeking affirmation of the following statement:-

In the spirit of reconciliation and solidarity the congregation of Glen Waverley Uniting Church acknowledge that the land on which we gather to praise God is part of the traditional lands of the Wurrundjeri people of the Kulin nation. Across this wide land we recognise the First People's continuing connection to country, water and community, and recognise Elders past, present and emerging.

Council has not yet considered how or where the statement might be presented publicly.

It has been pleasing to note that a couple of visitors from the community have also participated a couple of times. **Leisure Time - Laurel Muir:** Leisure Time celebrated 40 years of service to the community on 29th October. This took the form of a brunch with a short "history" of Leisure Time and a visual display of guests both past and present together with photos of outings and activities.

The numbers each week continue to be encouraging - 16 to 18. There was an outing to the Waverley Cinema in September to see the film "Crazy Rich Asians" - enjoyed by all. This was followed by a basket lunch at the theatre. Another outing was be held on 22nd October - a lunch at the Dandenong Club.

The format that Leisure Time will take in 2019 continues to be under discussion. More volunteers are needed, and the responses received from current volunteers in the next couple of weeks will determine just how things will proceed.

(This decline in numbers is apparently common to playgroups throughout Glen Waverley.) In each session the children love the new play shop in room 3 and everyone enjoys the playground on sunny days. The Tuesday group is planning a visit to Chesterfield Farm in November. It has been decided to hold a combined Christmas party and breakup on the first Monday in December when Santa will visit.

We are again grateful to Geraldine, Judith and the Hub team for arranging to take the nativity dress up photos again this year.

The new Connections Chinese fathers' playgroup began recently and was very successful. Bev attended to help the Connections team settle in in rooms 2 and 3 and the playground. Thanks to Glyn, a new collection of Chinese story books and games has been purchased for their use.

Badminton - **Andrew Hosking:** This group continues to flourish, welcoming a good number of energetic people from the local community to our church. The group's search for a suitable new table continues!

Welfare - Dorothy Lockart: The committee is most appreciative of the support of Church groups such as UCAF and individual congregational members who make regular donations of food and household supplies for distribution to clients. There continues to be a constant demand for assistance from members of the local community who are in need. All contributions are passed on confidentially and carefully to recipients. We thank God for our generous donors and pray for those who find it so difficult to ask for help in hard times.
