#### The Christian Church in the World (MAY)

#### INDIA NEEDS A BREAKTHROUGH AGAINST NATIONALISM

India's 2019 general election will take place in seven phases from 11 April to 19 May. The new parliament will be announced on 23 May. The Hindu nationalist BJP has ruled with a simple majority for the past five years. Its electoral success is the culmination of decades of strategic advance by highly organised nationalist forces. It seeks to unite Indians as Hindus and is hostile to Christianity, which it demonises as a threat to national security and social cohesion. Wherever Hindu nationalism advances, communalism and violent persecution of Christians escalates. Hindu nationalism is making headway in areas where Christianity has long been established and/or growing. Please pray for the Church in India and for a breakthrough against nationalism.

#### SOMALI CHURCH BEING ATTACKED

Somalia is one of the world's most dangerous places to be a Christian. Al-Shabaab hunts down and executes Christian converts. Somali Muslims maintain that Christianity has no place in Somalia. Civil war and famine have forced hundreds of thousands of Somalis to flee into Kenya, where they have access to Kenyan and international aid workers and teachers, many of whom are Christian. A small and vulnerable ethnic Somali Church is taking root both inside war-wracked Somalia and in eastern Kenya's Somali-dominated Garissa County. Kenya might offer freedom and opportunity, but the work among Somalis is still incredibly dangerous. On March 8 Pastor Abdul (Somali, aged 30, married, father of three) was severely beaten in Garissa by Somali Muslims. Though relocated, his family fear for their lives. #### June Issue of NewView

#### GROUP TO VISIT MANADO, SULAWESI, INDONESIA

A small group from this congregation will leave on the evening of 14 May to visit our sister church, GMIM Riedel, in Tondano (Manado). The Uniting Church through UnitingWorld recently signed a memorandum of understanding with the GMIM denomination in Indonesia. Part of the memorandum was a desire to receive visitors and make visits.

Two years ago a group from Riedel visited our congregation to learn about how we are "church" here in Australia and they had a particular interest in how we offer ministry to children. At the time the group was keen for a group from here to make a return visit.

You may recall that in April last year, Alanee attended a big youth conference in Manado called the Asian Ecumenical Youth Christian Conference and visited the Riedel congregation afterwards.

Our group is made up of Rev Neil Peters, Vida Foo, Susan Chan, Lina Liu, Glyn Howells, Willie and Yoke Cornelis, and Lucky Kalonta will arrive during the visit. The group will involve themselves in the life of the church. We will meet the Moderator of GMIM. Neil will preach in three different churches across the two Sundays. There is a lot of interest in our visit from neighbouring GMIM churches. We want to support and learn from our brothers and sisters in Christ. We want to learn of their culture and of their life and ministry as a congregation.

We will take gifts of the 'fall' made by Sue Morgan, stoles made by Susan Karoly and crosses and candle holders made by Bill Norquay, as well as personal gifts for our hosts.

While at Riedel we will present a donation on behalf of the UCAF from their annual luncheon for a Riedel congregation project to establish a Christian radio station.

#### WALKATHON FOR SCHOOLS MINISTRY

Glen Waverley Uniting Church held its 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Walkathon in support of our local schools ministry. Our minister, Rev Neil Peters, had this idea 4 years ago as a fundraiser to support local schools ministry and in particular the position of school chaplain at Glen Waverley Secondary College. Neil had no idea of the interest this initiative would create in the congregation.

The walkathon is now 8, 2.5 km laps which makes it 20 kms for anyone who does all 8 laps. Families, older people, singles, couples, and dogs now participate in the walk and others sponsor. A small team put on morning tea and lunch. It is a wonderful time to walk and chat and get to know people. Some walk one lap, some walk a few and a small number walk all laps. Each of the first three walkathons raised in excess of \$3500 each which was so encouraging for all involved. The Walkathon takes place on the last Saturday in April.

The schools ministry supported includes the school chaplain position at Glen Waverley Secondary College which unfortunately was ceased by the school at the end of 2018. One member of the congregation teaches SRI Christianity in Primary Schools and we cover her \$360 partnership contribution. Glen Waverley Uniting Church also has a small and dedicated team who put on a pancake breakfast each Thursday morning at Glen Waverley Secondary College. The purpose of the breakfast is to build a sense of community and support among the students, and staff from the school Well Being team sometimes attend. We serve about 250 students pancakes each week. The Walkathon funds the costs of this program.

This year 36 different walkers participated and 4 people, including Neil, walked all 8 laps beginning at 8 am and finishing at 2 pm. All who participate find it a great day. We now wait to see what we raised this year.

#### Faith Development Missional Group - BLOGSPOT!

At the Edge of the Enclosure is the Rev Suzanne Guthrie's website. She is an American Episcopalian (Anglican) priest with an interest in personal reflection. At the Edge of the Enclosure offers a weekly self-guided retreat on the Gospel lesson for the coming Sunday, and it offers material for Bible study, personal reflection and sermon preparation.

Each week, Suzanne provides material on the Gospel reading for the coming Sunday. The gospel reading is printed first. She takes a theme from that reading and develops it, beginning with what she calls "Self-Guided Retreat". This is then followed by some quotations (usually three) from famous writers down the ages to meditate on – some examples of the people she quotes from include Archbishop Desmond Tutu, St Augustine, Walter Hilton, Dorothy Day, Thomas Merton, Blaise Pascal, Ruth Burrows, Mother Teresa, Martin Luther King, St. Thérèse of Lisieux. After the quotations, she concludes with her own meditation on the theme.

Her webpage always includes some beautiful art work on the theme.

Here is her Self-Guided Retreat on the good Samaritan

But a Samaritan while traveling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Luke 10:33-35

Imagine waking up from a trauma and finding yourself alone except for your bosom enemy caring for you at your bedside, having scraped you up off the road and paid your hospital bills. Jesus crafted a story to shock the boundaries of relationship. The relentless reversals of the Good News shatter boundary, status quo, any comfort upon which a wearied soul might like to settle down.

Who is my neighbour and who is my family? Who is my friend and to whom and what am I called to be friend? As boundaries shatter, neighbour, family, enemy, the Divine, draw close.
