The Christian Church in the World

Christian aid workers held captive: Australian missionary doctor Ken Elliot (aged 84) has been held captive for nearly three years by a group associated with Al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb (AQIM). Dr Elliott and his wife, Jocelyn, had run a 120-bed charitable medical clinic in Djibo, northern Burkina Faso, for over 40 years before they were abducted on 15 January 2016. Whilst Mrs Elliot was subsequently released, Dr Elliot is being held by AQIM in the Malian desert along with several other foreigners, most of whom are aid workers and Christian. Please pray that the Lord will sustain, protect, comfort, encourage and deliver Dr Elliott and his fellow captives, and that the Elliotts can return to operating the greatly needed clinic in Djibo.

Asylum Seeker Support Group Update

The Asylum Seeker Support Group would like to thank the Glen Waverley Uniting Church congregation for its support in 2018. The boxes in our foyer for donations of useful items and specific foods were well patronised, and the goods were distributed to either the Dandenong Asylum Seeker Centre or Lentara Asylum Seeker Project. We collected 53 boxes of linen, clothing and sundry small household items as well as 5 boxes of non-perishable food items and cleaning agents. Our association with the Outer Eastern Asylum Seeker Support Network has continued. New links are being made with other groups south and east of the city. A continuing concern has been the situation of those detained on Nauru and Manus, and the secrecy surrounding their care, particularly medical care.

While Glen Waverley is too expensive an area for asylum seekers to live in, we can do much to assist in their support by fund-raising. We have been active in raising funds for the support of asylum seekers currently supported by Uniting Lentara. COP funding and donations, a concert held by Free Spirit, and money raised from honey sales etc amounted to over \$7000 in 2018, and we have plans for 2019 commencing with a BBQ at Pinewood on February 16 (volunteers invited!). The forthcoming federal elections are an opportunity to ensure that our elected representatives hear our concerns for these most vulnerable members of our community, and we hope to create opportunities for learning more about refugee policies.

Faith Development Missional Group - BLOGSPOT!

The internet is a source of valuable devotional material especially for those of us who lead worship. The Faith Development Missional Group has asked me to introduce some of these resources via the Monthly Bulletin.

I begin with "Listening to the stones" which is the Blog of the New Kilpatrick Parish Church in Bearsden, just north of Glasgow, Scotland. The Church's motto is "open hearts, open minds, open faith". Each week, the minister of the church, the Rev Roddy Hamilton, writes a new liturgy for Sunday worship. As the website savs:

Being a free church, in that we aren't required to use specific litural for any specific occasion, nearly all our liturgy is freshly written for each Sunday.

That means, excepting the Lord's Prayer and the Amen, no one will have heard what you will hear on a Sunday anywhere else or in any other era. Of course. we love our heritage and tradition but that tradition is constantly in flux with the world and so our liturgy is new each week responding to that world, and holding onto that which anchors us through our traditions. Sometimes it works beautifully, marrying the season to world events, to the Gospel, to the text. Other times it isn't a perfect match but that is when we learn most about ourselves and the adventure we are on and realise we are creators with God in finding new words within The Word.

Here you'll find some of the original prayers, reflections and creative moments we have used.

I have chosen a couple of pieces from the website to whet your appetites.

Gathering

Welcome to church: not a place, but an invitation; not a building. but a way of engaging; not a service. but a way of serving; not an institution, but a path to adventure.

In this new year let us gather and welcome each other make space for all decide to love more and break the rules of the world with the generosity of the kingdom And if anyone asks 'whv?' or 'how?' or 'what does it all mean?' simply use Jesus' own words: Come and see

Unlock

Thomas is interesting. Obviously, he is out and about in the world when Jesus makes his first appearance. The disciples are generally locked in to the upper room. They don't go out. They are scared. Thomas doesn't seem to be there.

What about faith shuts us in, scared to go out faithfully?

What about believing in God makes us hesitate, embarrassed?

What about being in the church keeps us from telling folk that beyond the walls.

Thomas does a difficult thing. When he sees Jesus he takes what he fears and decides to move out into the world with new belief, trust.

It is a lesson for us: Church doesn't work well when it is shut in. closed to the world, to the questions and debates and conversations.

Faith is an adventure in the world

Faith has questions

Faith explores doubts and certainties

Faith opens doors and takes us into what us uncertain.

Salt dough

Take a wee bit and make an impression of a key in the dough and take it with you

Let it dry

and leave it somewhere as a reminder: belief doesn't have everything sorted, it opens doors, takes you out into the world where there is a lot of uncertainty and dares us to believe ...
