Faith Development Missional Group - Blogspot!

This month I would like to introduce Rev Carolyn Winfrey Gillette to you. She is an American Presbyterian minister and hymn-writer who has published two books of hymns - *Songs of Grace: New Hymns for God and Neighbour* and *Gifts of Love: New Hymns for Today's Worship* - and has written many more hymns as well. Her hymns have fresh, contemporary words and images and she sets them to well-known hymn tunes so singers can concentrate on the words without having to cope with learning a new tune at the same time. She writes hymns which follow Lectionary themes, but also writes hymns with social justice themes. Here are two examples of her hymns.

A new hymn for immigrant families - When Jesus Went to Egypt Tune: Passion Chorale ("O sacred head, sore wounded")

When Jesus went to Egypt, Safe on his mother's arm, His parents stayed beside him To keep him safe from harm. And when they crossed the border, They were allowed to be Together - seeking refuge -A Holy Family.

O God, we pray for children And families coming here Now facing separation, And filled with grief and fear. For children, loved and treasured, Are ripped from loving kin. This deed, by any measure, Is torture. It's a sin!

O God, you're like a mother Who won't forsake her own. You're like a loving father Who welcomes his son home. Now give us, by your Spirit, The strength to challenge wrong, To seek the best for children, And keep all families strong.

When Giving Your Gifts

Tune: Hanover ("O worship the King, all glorious above")

When giving your gifts, don't let others see; don't point to yourselves and say, "Look at me!" For some think that praise is its own great reward, but gifts made in secret are blessed by the Lord.

When talking to God, don't be on display; just go in your room and quietly pray. And when you are fasting, don't make it a show, for God is the only one needing to know.

Don't store for yourselves the treasures of Earth, for kept on their shelves, they'll lose what they're worth. The moth will consume them, the rust will destroy, and thieves will take all that you hope to enjoy.

O Lord, you have said: Seek treasures above like sharing of bread and labor of love, like kindness to strangers and gifts to the poor. These gifts, given humbly, will surely endure.
