COMMUNAL VIOLENCE THREATENS PROGRESS IN ETHIOPIA

The great reform work being done by Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed could be undone if escalating communal violence cannot be contained. More than 2.4 million Ethiopians are now displaced because of communal violence, much of which is believed to be incited by political elements opposed to PM Abiy's reforms. In early February, three mosques were burnt in a majority Christian region in the north, while at least ten churches were burnt in a majority Muslim region in the south. As in the more numerous cases of pure ethnic violence, majorities are attacking minorities and local police are not intervening. In each case of religious violence, it was incited by a false report and then carefully organised. Please pray that God will complete the good work he has begun in Ethiopia. *from Religious Liberty Prayer Bulletin*.

PAKISTAN COURT FINALLY ACQUITS ASIA BIBI

On Tuesday 29 January, the Supreme Court of Pakistan upheld its earlier acquittal of Christian woman, Asia Bibi. She was under guard at a secret location following her acquittal last October. Asia Bibi was falsely accused of blasphemy against the Koran by Muslims in her community several years ago and was imprisoned on death row. The court expressed displeasure about the perjury the complainant committed against Asia and other witnesses. She is now free to go to Canada and join her two daughters already there. A radical anti-blasphemy party has said it would not accept any decision in favour of Ms Bibi's release and asked its followers to stage more mass protests. Pray for Asia Bibi's safe departure and for the Church in Pakistan. *from Religious Liberty Prayer Bulletin.*

Attention - Direct Debit Givers

UCA Funds Management administer the Direct Debit system used by most Direct Debit givers at GWUC and provide the Giving Recording Committee with the amounts given by each individual giver which we use in our half yearly letters to each of you. This information is known only to members of the committee and is not provided to anyone else at GWUC.

They have just informed me that, due to privacy concerns, they will no longer provide individual giving details without explicit permission to do so from the giver. To obtain this permission they have, or will very soon, send a letter to each direct debit giver with a form to be returned to them.

If you do not return the form we will no longer receive any information about how much, or even if, you are giving via Direct Debit. This will affect only the information the committee receives. It will not alter the process of deducting the amount of money you have specified and transferring it to GWUC. But it will mean that it will no longer be possible to provide you with a half-yearly letter.

If you do fill out and return the form nothing will change.

Please note that UCA FM have told me that they have forgotten to include reply-paid envelopes in some of the letters they have sent out. If you receive one of these letters you can send it back to them at no cost in an unstamped envelope using the address "UCA Funds Management, Reply Paid 69601, Melbourne 3000" or e-mail to info@ucafunds.com.au.
