Worship area heating

Thank you for the feedback and concerns on the heating in the worship area. We have had our Air Conditioning consultant come last Monday and look at all the settings of the system to try and reduce some of the concerns. He found they had not configured one north west unit correctly and has reconfigured the system settings.

Just turning the system off during worship, as raised, would have created further problems later in worship. The startup fan noise and initial air flow would have been far more uncomfortable and disruptive to our worship, and leaving it off would have caused discomfort to others in the worship area who feel the cold terribly.

We all have different warmth expectations that are difficult to meet, but we try. We trust that the changes made will help. Please always continue to share your thoughts with us.
