Over many years Glen Waverley Uniting Church has been fortunate to receive generous bequests and gifts from people who have been worshippers, guests and have come to enjoy and respect the endeavours of our Church and its many volunteers and leaders.

For several months we have been in discussions with the Trustees and Executors of the Estate of Gwenda Henry.

Gwenda Henry worshipped at Glen Waverley Uniting Church for many years and can be described as a devoted quiet achiever who was always willing to assist but also very generous.

Our discussions have been finalised and we can now convey our joy and appreciation having received a generous bequest of \$50,000 to be used by the Glen Waverley Uniting Church for appropriate Community Service Projects which would aid the work of the Church and benefit people in need through those programmes. It is anticipated that these funds will be used on projects approved by Church Council over a period of approximately 3 years.

The family and Trustees wish the congregation to be aware of the Bequest and the details of its use. We in turn will regularly advise the Trustees and Executors of our actions and programmes.

#### The Christian Church in the World

#### Christian Crisis in North India

India's Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) not only outcampaigned its rivals to win the election in a landslide, but also ran a sophisticated and subversive campaign of mass manipulation through social media. Analysing data, the BJP covertly (not using its own name) 'microtargeted' individuals and groups with custom messages delivered primarily through Facebook and WhatsApp. This strategy created a customised enemy for every group, then posited the BJP as the solution. Thus, to secure the political conversions required to win, the BJP divided communities and fuelled communal tensions. The result is escalating polarisation and persecution. This includes extreme violence and crippling boycotts, with Christians being denied access to life's necessities such as food, water, work and housing. The situation is extremely serious. Please pray for India and its Christians.

#### **Eritrean Regime Escalates Persecution of Church**

In May over 170 Protestant Christians were arrested in Asmara. In June the government seized 22 medical clinics. On 13 June five Orthodox priests were arrested for protesting government interference in Church affairs. Up to 23 August another 150 Christians have been arrested. Officials arrested 70 members of the Faith Mission Church of Christ (FMCoC) in Keren. Authorities closed the church-run school. The FMCoC was the last church still open in the majority-Muslim city 90km north-west of Asmara. Other Christians have gone into hiding. On 18 August police arrested 80 Christians from Godaif south of Asmara. On 16 August six Christian government employees were taken to court where the judge told them to renounce their faith. They said they would 'not negotiate their faith' and would 'continue following Jesus'. Please pray.

#### **Faith Development Missional Group – BLOGSPOT!**

Jim Burklo, a United Church of Christ pastor and writer, is the Associate Dean of Religious Life at the University of Southern California, USA. He calls his website "Musings" and that is what it is – musings on life and faith. He puts it this way: *The older I get, the more I know about how little I know. I'm increasingly giddy in the face of it all. Who am I to preach and write about the divine, when I hardly fathom what it is to be human? Bear with me, believe with me, hope with me, endure with me as we muse about it together....* 

Here is part of his musing entitled "The Coyotes of Hollywood".

For months, I've been hiking a lot more, and a lot longer, than I did before. It all started when I became unemployed, and suddenly had more time to enjoy the great outdoors. I used the time on the trail to practice a simple meditation. I kept asking myself the same question, over and over: "Am I here?" It is a gentle way to snap myself out of obsession with what is on my mind, and be more fully present and aware of the beauty that surrounds me. Am I here, really here? Not lost in thought about what I'm going to do next, or what I want to do next, or where I next want to be. Am I here, fully aware that my feet are on the dirt and my gaze is on the mountains and trees?

This week I started as the Associate Dean of Religious Life at the University of Southern California, in Los Angeles. Instead of taking long walks in the woods of Marin County I'm living and working in the heart of America's biggest city. Each day I ride a bus to the Metro, take the subway to Macarthur Park station, and from there hop on another bus to USC. So far, on that bus, I'm the only white person aboard.

The traumatic part of it, for me, is that I've moved from Marin County, which abounds with gorgeous open space, to Los Angeles, which lacks it. So, each evening, I seek out what there is to find. I take a sunset hike up Beachwood Canyon, a densely-populated street that ends at a dirt road leading into the 5-square-mile Griffith Park. It's an island of natural landscape surrounded by the vast metropolis. I hike up the dirt road to a turn that affords a panorama of the top of the park's ridgeline. I stand there for a while and listen to the coyotes yipping across the canyon. And I thank God for them! Because I know that their crazy howling can bring sanity to a new city-slicker like myself, whose head is abuzz with all that comes with a new job.

The coyotes are yelping the human equivalent of the words "I am here!" "I am here!" They remind me to ask again: Am I here? Am I paying attention? When I am on the bus, am I here? When I am working in my office, am I here? When I am on the dirt trail gazing at the chaparral in Griffith Park, am I here?

I praise the Lord for the coyotes of Hollywood. "Ow oooooh! Yip yip yip!" They let me know they are here. I'm working on being here, too - body and soul.
