#### **Emergency Ministry Volunteers**

The Victorian Council of Churches supports Emergency Ministry Volunteers to offer a listening ear and compassion in times of crisis. Volunteers are lay or ordained and undergo training to be equipped for this role.

Emergencies can create chaos in people's lives. Emergencies include fires, floods, storms, car accidents, criminal attacks or terrorist attacks. The VCC volunteers are trained and can be called out to be a calm and compassionate presence. The volunteers have the time to talk with and support affected people. Sometimes a listening ear is all that is needed. Sometimes people will be referred on to other support services.

#### Planned Giving - Direct Debit Offering

This is an alternative to giving in the open plate or by the envelope system.

The advantages of Direct Debit giving are increasingly being recognised by the congregation - these include no need for envelopes or cash, regular deductions are assured and a reduced workload on Finance Stewards

Uethical(Synod) provides the service of Direct Debit offering.

Under the Privacy Act they have decided they are restricted from giving information about givers to their respective congregations. This change in the situation is beyond our control. But we give paramount importance to the protection of individual information.

In view of this, they require a consent form which allows them to advise our congregation with details of your giving. This includes new givers, any change in amount and cancellation of the giving.

It is this information which enables our committee to provide you with a half yearly letter advising the amount of deductions received.
