An Opportunity to support drought and bushfire affected communities.

Many of us have been very concerned for rural communities going through drought across many parts of Australia. Even when rain comes it takes a lot of time for farmers and rural communities to recover from drought conditions. The impact of drought contributes to rising mental health issues. It impacts families and relationships. There are many rural communities going through very tough times.

Now many rural communities have been contending with significant and devastating bushfires. Homes, properties, businesses, livestock and other animals have been destroyed and many people are facing a very uncertain future. Much money has been raised for emergency relief. But there will be ongoing need for support in these communities.

I have had a few people speak to me about how can we assist the long-term recovery of these rural communities. The church council has approved this week a retiring offering at each service on the last Sunday of the month from February to November 2020. On even months the offering will support the Uniting VicTas 2020 Bush Fire Appeal to fund services to help communities recover and on odd months the funds will be given to UCA Frontier Services for drought relief.

So, on Sunday 23 Feb there will be a retiring offering for long term bushfire relief through Uniting.

Then on Sunday 29 March there will be a retiring offering for drought relief through Frontier Services.

These appeals are commended to you for your consideration. The money will be forwarded regularly through our office.

If you prefer to donate through the office or direct to the church bank account then mark it for bushfire or drought. If you prefer a receipt, the office can provide you with the details to donate direct to Uniting or Frontier Services.
