

Lighting a candle

The Catholic and Orthodox Churches have a long-standing tradition of lighting a candle for someone in need. More recently, Protestant Churches have taken up this practice. At the back of our church, we do not have a stand for lighting candles, but we have a prayer tree covered in small electric lights and we are encouraged to add prayers to this tree by writing on a paper leaf and attaching it to the tree.

Lighting a candle for someone is often done in a church, but it can be done at home. In this time of isolation because of the Covid-19 virus, this is one way in which we can pray for others in our homes. When we light a candle for someone, the flame reminds us of the person we are praying for, and it also reminds us of our Creator God who said in the beginning "Let there be light"; the light also reminds us of Jesus, the Light of the World, and the moving flame reminds us of the Holy Spirit. When we light a candle for someone no words are required. The candlelight is our prayer and that is all that is needed. All we need to do is light the candle and spend a few moments in quiet reflection watching the flame.

When I was working, whenever any of my colleagues were heading overseas, I would give them a two-dollar coin and ask them to light a candle for me in a sacred place somewhere on their travels. It was up to them to decide where to light the candle. It didn't have to be a Christian setting – all I asked was that the candle should be lit in a sacred place. Without exception, my colleagues took my request seriously and always reported back as to where they had lit their candle and why they had chosen that particular place.

The Brisbane Catholic Education Office, embracing modern technology, provides an opportunity to light a candle on line. It can be for a special need or simply to say "thank you" to God. The Education Office's **Light a prayer candle** website has this to say: *In many different traditions lighting candles is a sacred action. In the Catholic Christian tradition, lighting a candle is an old, old ritual of prayer used individually and together; found in cathedrals and roadside shrines; lit in need or in gratitude. It is a sign of God's presence and the light of Christ. In this candle prayer site, we are gathered in a special way: on our own, yet part of a wide community; lighting our own candles, yet drawing from the light of a great communion. This marvellous reality of presence, seen and unseen is the deep treasure of our tradition.*
