Follow the star to the One True light.

"I can't believe that it is nearly Christmas again, this year has just flown."

That is a comment I have heard over recent days, one which seems to be more common every year as we lead ever busier lives.

What does a comment like "Christmas again," mean for us, as we celebrate this season year after year. Has it become so familiar to us - the busyness, the parties, the rush, the shopping, cooking and eating - that we are almost glad when it is all over?

For many it is a time of grief, and loneliness, for others it is a season they can't afford. Yet is continues to be one of the most special times of the church year, a time of celebration which is only made possible because of Easter. We are familiar with the birth story told in Matthew's Gospel which tells of a bright star that led those wise three to the One true light, but are often puzzled by the reading from John's Gospel about a man named John witnessing to the light that was to come.

It's a popular saying, and it can be upsetting and annoying if you are the one who is being "kept in the dark".

Over 2000 years ago the One who was "the light of the world," came among us.

You are like the wise ones who followed the star, you are like John, who witnessed to the light. I had a candle on one of my birthday cakes that my family made for me. Every time I thought I had blown it out, it would light up again. That's the kind of light I am speaking about.

Let that light dawn upon us this Christmas, let that light once again light up the world in all its darkness and not seem as though it is for ever under a bushel. May your experience of Christmas this year be for you as though you were coming out of a dark room needing your eyes to be adjusted to the light.

The true light, which enlightens everyone, a light which allows us this Christmas to celebrate once again the good news of the Gospel that at Christmas the Word became flesh and lived among us.
