The Uniting Church came into being with much excitement and anticipation on 22 June 1977. At the time it was felt that this new denomination would demonstrate and symbolize the unity that God desired for the Church and the unity that Jesus prayed for in John's gospel. The name of this new denomination said loudly that unity was important.

One of the changes that I have noticed since then has been the Uniting Church becoming much more cross-cultural. Some of our larger congregations are Korean and Tongan UCs. The contribution of people from around the world has enriched our congregational life and our worship life and is also a sign of unity.

We are using the key words 'unity' and 'maturity' for our anniversary theme this year. The words come from Ephesians chapter 4. The message in recent services has reminded us that unity is an aspect of the work of, and the gift offered by, the Holy Spirit. Unity is more than we can manufacture as members of a congregation. Sure, we should treat one another with respect, with understanding, with patience, with trust and with acceptance – these qualities will greatly assist the life, the cohesion and the unity of a congregation – however, we are really united because we are followers of Jesus Christ, and the work of the Holy Spirit strengthens our unity. A cohesive and united congregation reflects the

maturity of the Christian people involved. A united and cohesive congregation should also be more effective in offering and growing its ministry and mission.

A congregation has a responsibility to build up the people of God in faith and service. As we are nurtured and fed in our Christian faith we grow in understanding and in maturity. As we learn, as we serve together, through worship, study and prayer, as we grow and nurture new leaders, we are seeking to grow mature followers of Jesus. This nurturing work involves programs in children's, families, youth and adult ministry. But more than just programs it involves those more mature in the faith coming alongside others and journeying with them. That is really the model that Jesus used with his disciples.

As we approach the anniversary it is important to remember those who have gone before us, who nurtured us in the faith, whether they be Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, fellowship or study leaders, camp leaders, ministers or other mature followers of Christ. Who was it that nurtured and encouraged you in your faith? Who has come alongside you and journeyed with you through a challenging time or when you took on a new role? It's good to remember those who encouraged us and stood with us. There are also those who gave us a gentle push of encouragement, who helped us identify our gifts and begin to

use them. There are probably many people who have helped us grow to maturity as followers of Jesus. Our parents and grandparents may have been influential. **Take** a moment to pause and be thankful for those people who influenced and guided you.

Then there are those who have had a vision for a congregation and worked and prayed it into being. There are those who have taken on a project, sometimes a project ahead of its time, and persisted to see the project become fruitful. We will always need people who can discern before God the way forward for a congregation. Glen Waverley Uniting has had many good and faithful leaders and servants over the years. We want to remember them with thankfulness and acknowledge their service.

Now it is we, who are part of this congregation now, who have the responsibility to carry on the ministry and mission of this congregation. Every generation has its opportunities to grow and support the ministry and mission of Christ.

Covid-19 Update and our Building complex

Council recently adopted the following statements about worship, reopening the church and meeting in homes.

As we are one congregation, we will not recommence worship until government, Synod and Presbytery advice make it possible for all services to begin.

Having considered the post June 1 regulations from government, and advice from Synod, Church Council agreed to the following guidelines to apply from June 1 to June 22.

Given the requirements of fewer than 20 persons and 4 square metres per person in a room of a church building, no meetings will be held at the church during this time. **The complex remains closed.**

While it may be legal for people to meet in homes, with fewer than 20 persons able to maintain 1.5m between them, that does not mean that it is advisable. Certainly no member should be pressured to attend. Whether to attend should be a free and considered decision of each member, considering their own health, exposure and vulnerability. Church Council cannot endorse such meetings as church groups.


