

COVID-19 Update for Congregations & Ministry Agents Port Phillip East Presbytery Uniting Church in Australia

Issue date: Thursday 26 March 2020

Greetings

What a week we've experienced! On Sunday night, the Prime Minister made it clear that places of worship are to be closed. Soon after it was clarified that exemptions would be made for funerals, with a maximum of 10 people, and weddings, with a maximum of 5 people (celebrant, couple, 2 witnesses). Communication from Synod has clarified for us that we are not to transfer our face-to-face worship gatherings into other venues or outside. Baptisms will need to be held at a later date when restrictions are lifted.

The Premier of Victoria has made it clear that we are to **stay home** wherever possible, and to avoid social gatherings. With this in mind, we should not be holding face-to-face meetings, in our church buildings, outside or in homes. This includes church council meetings and prayer meetings.

Presbytery staff are working from home. The Presbytery's committee meetings are continuing their work, meeting online through Zoom Meetings and through email. We are happy to support church councils and prayer meetings in trialling the use of Zoom Meetings, which allows for access using computers, tablets, mobile phones and landline phones.

The Centre for Ministry in Parkville is closed, and classes at Pilgrim are continuing online. People can call and leave a message with eLM staff or contact them directly as they will be working from home. *Uniting* has closed its Op Shops although staff are seeking to find other ways to support vulnerable people.

We have a number of congregations who are broadcasting worship services and reflections using Facebook, YouTube, Vimeo and Churchonline.com. If filming in the church building, we encourage congregations to limit involvement to a handful of people (up to 5) and ensure that 1.5 metre physical distancing is maintained. At some point, it is likely that we will need to run everything from our homes. Keep in mind the principles of sustainability and simplicity. Please

let presbytery know if you are offering services or resources online so we can add the details to our website.

Port Phillip East Presbytery Staying Safe during COVID-19 Pandemic A summary 26 March 2020

- 1. All worship services in church buildings were suspended from Monday 23 March.
- 2. It is no longer possible to meet together in our church buildings and we encourage congregations to continue to meet online and in small groups of people living in the same home.
- 3. All face-to-face gatherings, including council and committee meetings, Bible study groups, craft groups and non- associated groups need to be suspended. Consider online gathering arrangements, video conferencing or phone calls.
- 4. No outdoor church of any size activities including worship should be conducted as the priority at this time is the safety of the community and playing a part in reducing transmission rates of COVID-19.
- 5. There is a maximum of five essential personnel allowed to gather for the preparation of worship resources, and preferably less. Appropriate physical distancing must be adhered to (4 square metres per person and 1.5 metres apart), with strict hygiene practices.
- 6. If churches are producing printed resources, you can deliver them to members but with strict safety measures to comply with government regulations.
- 7. No more than 10 people may be present at funerals. We recognise that this is a most difficult restriction for our congregations and we encourage congregational leaders to, with permission, explore ways of enabling the community to grieve and the possibility of recording such events in preparation for memorial services in the future or find alternative ways of shaping a memorial or thanksgiving service online (see our webpage https://www.ucappep.org/funerals-and-weddings).
- 8. Weddings are permitted with only the couple, celebrant and witnesses (5 people maximum). The physical distancing rules apply.
- 9. All baptisms should be postponed until further notice.
- 10. It is now time for congregations who employ staff to move to skeleton staff only in your buildings no more than two people working in the office at any one time. Please encourage staff to work from home as much as possible.
- 11. If anyone is in the high-risk category for COVID-19, they must not be present.
- 12. Please continue to be in touch with your presbytery to share resources, ideas and ways of pastorally caring for each other at this time.
