Discussion with Video Clip Movie "School Tie" (1992,30 min)

Directed by Robert Mandel 14 min

School Ties is about 1950's small-town, working-class teen David Green (played by Brendan Fraser), who receives a football scholarship to St. Matthews, an exclusive prep school. His friendships become strained when another student reveals that David is Jewish. In this summary clip, David's identity is revealed and starting to lose his friendship. The movie comes to a climax when the classmates are forced to choose between Green and Dillon(Matt Damon) in a cheating scandal. This movie shows the religious inequality existed in America, and warns the presence of those victims in our society.

Discussion with Bible Story Philip's Cross-cultural Message(30 min)

Acts 8:26-40

26 Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) 27 So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship 28 and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. 29 Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." 30 So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" 31 He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. 32 Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. 33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth." 34 The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" 35 Then Philip began to speak,

and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. 36 As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" 37 38 He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. 39 When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. 40 But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea. (NRSV)

Apostle Philip

- One of disciples (Mtt 10:3)
- Told to Nathanael "We have found the one"(Jn 1:43-48)
- Helping Creeks to meet Jesus (Jn 12:21)
- Asked to Jesus, "Lord, show us the Father." (Jn 14:8)



Deacon Philip

- One of seven Deacons (Acts 6:5)
- Preached the word to Samaria. (Acts 8:5)
- Preached the word to the Ethiopian eunuch. (Acts 8:27)
- Visited by Paul at Caesarea (Acts 21:8)
- Called "Philip the Evangelist" (Acts 21:8)
