 included a smoking ceremony and entertainment by an indigenous group Yeng Gali as well as short speeches by several local and state politicians

- After meeting Councillor Elisha Lee at the NAIDOC week function, Margaret kept in touch about indigenous history of Glen Waverley. Elisha was good
 enough to spend some time researching what was available and sent two links that we can share with Church Council and the congregation, as appropriate.

**Deferred from our June meeting:

First Nations:

A Letter from the Moderator, Rev David Fotheringham (previously distributed) urges support and action about the Yoorrook Justice Commission report. See Yoorrook Justice Commission. See also Yoorrook Key Findings | Yoorrook Justice Commission which has 10 Key findings. Church Council (through Anne Newton) has asked OSJMG for some leadership on how best to raise awareness on this. Margaret will reply to Anne's email explaining progress to date. Also related to First Peoples matters, the UCA has produced a "Covenanting Pathways Toolkit" with ideas for congregations which can be found at Covenanting - Uniting Church in Australia. Synod of Victoria and Tasmania

**The OSJMG had a lengthy and thoughtful discussion on these matters, particularly on how to sensitively and respectfully encourage a deeper understanding of 1st Peoples issues in the wider congregation. Needs to be introduced slowly, perhaps starting with discussion about the Acknowledgement of Country. Ian informed us that Synod is also to discuss this matter in 2 weeks' time and that there may be ideas that he can bring back from that.

Margaret will request a hard copy of A Vision for a Just Australia – Uniting Church Australia, a set of seven Social Justice foundational issues for UCA congregations, one of which is "A First Peoples Heart". We will address this matter again at our October meeting.
