7 deaths in custody in the past 2 months

2 more people have been killed since the 30th anniversary of the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody. We must fight for justice and accountability for every person who has lost their life, every person who has lost a loved one, and every person who must fear how they will be treated in police custody.

Each of the lives lost in the hands of police custody is important. Their justice is important. Say their names, learn their stories, and fight for justice and accountability. The 'Deaths Inside' project tracks every known Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander death in custody in every jurisdiction from 2008 - 2021.
