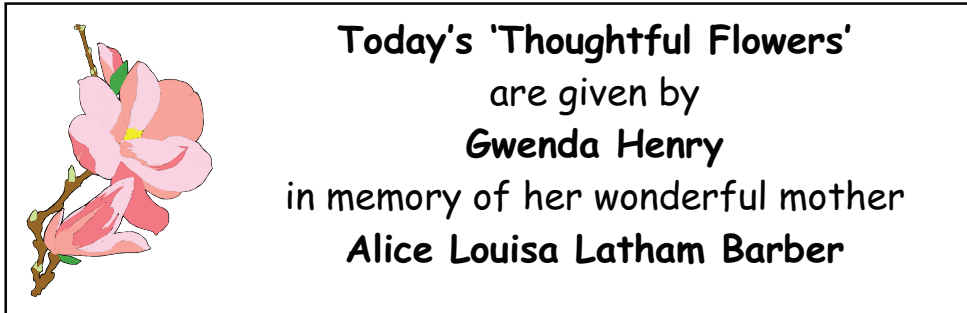

POST EASTER STUDY – “EVERYTHING MUST CHANGE”

This study is based on Brian McLaren’s book of the same name.

“Our world faces unprecedented challenges and crises and the church will either be part of the problem or part of the solution. To be part of the solution, followers of Christ must be ready for a bold new adventure of faith and action.”

Groups did this study during 2009. It sparked great debate and interest about what the life and teachings of Jesus have to say about current societal and global issues.

Part 2 – Brian McLaren’s two preoccupying questions:

What are the biggest problems in the world today?

What do the life and teachings of Jesus have to say about these global issues?

Is society able to take a radically different direction, so that our world will become a very different place – sustainable, peaceful and equitable?

The group thought that young people, in the church and elsewhere, were giving us leads and encouragement to look outside “the square”.

Although there are 8 Sessions in the complete study, one may join the group at any stage and attend as many sessions as one would wish.

To have read the relevant chapters (Parts) of the book pertaining to a Session would be advantageous but not essential.

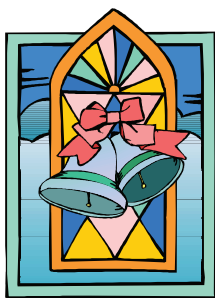

Golden Rules

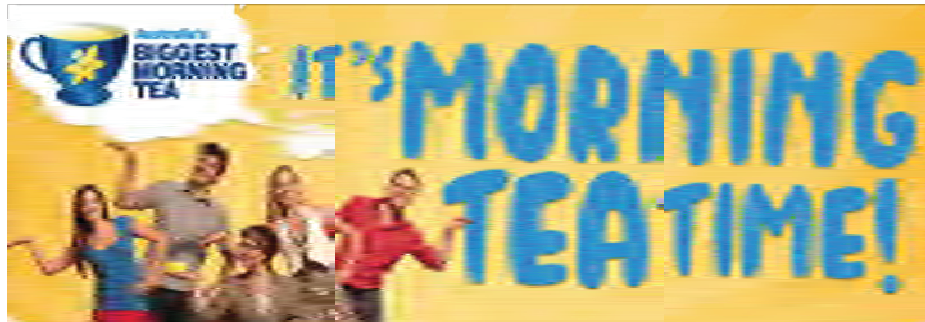

COMMUNITY OF FAITH MISSIONAL GROUP – MAY REPORT 2010

Evelyn and Herb Fleming are leading a study group on Thursday nights on Brian McLaren's book "Everything Must Change".

Coming up – 30 May 2010 (5th Sunday) – combined 10.00 am worship. Guest preacher is Rev Ross Langmead. Ross is a Baptist minister and is currently Dean of Whitley College. He is passionate about mission and is a gifted hymn writer and musician (for example, see Hymn 681 in "Together in Song").

The Community of Faith Group has been asked by Church Council to discuss the suggestion that we should move permanently to two morning services (8.00 am and 10.00 am). The Group is actually looking at all service times and is discussing issues such as:

What sorts of services should we offer? E.g., Youth oriented, Families and Children oriented, Reflective/intimate, Contemporary/experimental/interactive, Traditional, Combined, Healing.**

What service times should we offer and how many services?
How should we cater for children who attend in the morning?
What is more important - the number at worship or style of worship?

How do we utilise the skills and abilities of our various musicians to best fit worship styles?

How can we keep work loads on ministerial staff reasonable?
How can we utilise and encourage lay leadership in worship?

Comments from members of the congregation, Elders and Church Councillors are helping us in our deliberations. We hope to have a report ready for the May Church Council meeting.

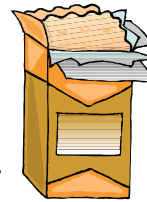

COP ASSESSMENT CRITERIA 2010

Assessment Criteria for Congregational Outreach Projects (COP) 2010

Criteria

The following criteria help the COP Selection Panel draw up a short list of Projects to recommend to the Congregation.

1. That we donate the funds that we raise as a response to Christ's commission to His Church. Our aim is to follow the example of Jesus in providing practical assistance to needy people in our world.
2. That we support Projects that are within the spirit of the UCA mission.
3. That we ensure that any Project is:
 - openly accountable to the public;
 - viable;
 - managed by trustworthy people;
 - and meets appropriate legal requirements.
4. That our preference is to support ministries in which we as a Congregation have some personal contact through our members who are engaged in them. In this way we can be kept involved and informed about their work.
5. That each submission comprises a completed COP Application Form and any supporting information.

Editing Wiki Pages

The ability to edit a wiki page changes the whole philosophy of web-based information - no longer is control of the information in the hands of a select few webmasters, but it is now open to all the users of the page. It is like having a car that you could change the design of as you drive it. Imagine the changes you might make to a car if you had this ability - you could make it a small two-seater when commuting to work, a station wagon or van when moving goods, a four-wheel drive when camping, and so on. I'm sure you can think of other examples.

Using the GUI Editor

You can try these instructions out without fear of damaging anything by using the wiki test page, at

Go to this page, and try out the following instructions:

On the header of this (and every) page, there is a menu bar with items such as Edit (Text), Edit (GUI), Info, and so on. This section describes what happens when you click the Edit (GUI) link. New users will probably find this form of editing to be the easiest to use, since it is very like popular WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get) word processing applications (Microsoft Word, for example).

Clicking the link places you in edit mode. You see much the same form of the text on the page, but now there is an edit bar at the top of the text. In this bar a number of tool icons, which should show a short explanatory hint for each as you hover your mouse over them one by one.

The text itself is now live, meaning that when you click in it, and start typing, the characters that you type will be inserted into the page. Not only that, but you can delete things and change the format as well. Try opening up a page and editing it now. (If you are worried about breaking anything, go to the TestPage and edit that. It will not matter what changes you make to that page.) Try double clicking on a word, then click the bold B icon to make it bold. Clicking on the B icon again will turn off the bold face. Or you can use the I icon to make your word italic. Or both. Or underlined, or even all three!

The other icons in the tool bar can be explored at your leisure. You can make numbered lists, bullet point lists, indented text, 'outdent' indented text, add links to other web pages (remember, a link to another wiki page is just a WikiName!), and lots of other interesting things. One which many might find useful is the 'Paste from Word' icon, but let's not rush too fast.

When you have made a number of changes, you might want to click the Preview button at the top of the edit window, just above the tool bar icons. This will show your page as it will finally appear, so it is handy for checking what you have done without actually finishing your edits. But more importantly, it saves an interim copy, so if you have to go away, or worse, your system crashes, it will be there when you come back, and start editing the page again.

Of course, once you have finished your edits, you will want to make them available to other readers. Click the Save Changes button to do this. It is good to also write a brief comment in the Comment: box just below the edit window, so that others can quickly see what your changes were about.
