Hi everyone,

Just letting you know that we (the team of 7) did arrive safely at Nakuru in Kenya.

The first leg of the flight (to Doho) was a long 14 hours but as comfortable as practical in an airline. Doho seemed a large flat place with no greenery in sight. No aerobridge for unloading, although some in construction. A bus took us to the transfer terminal. From there the next departure lounge for our flight to Nairobi. A 10 km bus trip to the plane down a gravelly and part paved area. This flight took 6 hours.

The MIA drivers were becoming concerned as our flight took longer than it should have, so were very pleased to see us when we arrived. The journey from the airport to Nakuru took 3 hours over a variety of roads. We saw a lot on the drive. We drove through the side of Nairobi, a very flat city, mediocre roads with cars and trucks everywhere.

Once we left Nairobi we started climbing and climbing for most of our journey - not surprising as Nakuru is 2000 metres above sea level. The trip wasn't very pleasant. The standard of driving is dangerous to say the least. There were many slow trucks on the road, too many with black diesel smoke pouring out of the exhaust. Many drivers try to pass and do pass dangerously. On the day of our travel there was an exceptional amount of traffic.

However, we did arrive safely. Ivan (Mission In Action Manager) said he did not see us arrive but knew we had by the noise from the children who were excited to see those they knew and some new faces.

We had a good dinner provided ... the best soup I had ever tasted (some sort of vegetable, pumpkin, potato creamed) then a new fresh salad and other good things.

As I write this, Kat is writing the blog so make sure you check that out too.
