Church Council - Organ Replacement

Church Council at its recent meeting decided to proceed with the replacement of the church organ. The money needed to purchase a new organ will be underwritten by Deferred Maintenance Funds, but Council also asked the Organ Committee to pursue various additional fund raising options, in order to minimise the budgetary effect of the need to replenish the Deferred Maintenance Funds over the next few budget years.

One particular option, the establishment of an Organ Fund, will be put in place as soon as possible. The Growing Generous Givers campaign has previously identified such "one-off" campaigns as an essential part of the church budgetary process, and we encourage you to view this fund in the same light. Instead of donating a whole organ (which you cannot take to heaven), we offer the alternative of "sponsoring an organ stop"! Please talk with one of the members of the organ committee, Geoff Willis, if you wish to make this commitment.

Members wishing to make a donation to the Organ Fund may do so at their convenience by placing their donation in an envelope clearly marked "Organ Fund" and placing it in the offering plate at a Sunday Service or lodging it at the Church Office. These donations will be recorded, along with the donor's name if stated on or inside the envelope. If you wish your donation to be anonymous, please so indicate with your donation.
