The four groups of the Community Hub continue to connect with many people from the community each week.

Something new and exciting is happening at The Hub. Story Hub will be commencing on Thursday 16th August at 11am. Story Hub is for preschool children and their parents or grandparents. It will include stories, singing and a craft activity for the children, also a cuppa for the adults.

Our next special morning tea at The Hub will be held on Thursday August 30th when we will have a Muffin Morning, 10am – 12noon. We hope you, your family and friends will be able to come and enjoy some yummy muffins.

A few of our Leisure Time volunteers have been attending training workshops at the Monash Volunteer Resource Centre. The first workshop was "What to do in an Emergency".

An ambulance paramedic told us about the Ambulance Service and encouraged us to quickly call 000 if a medical emergency arises. He also explained the latest information about CPR (30 compressions followed by 2 breaths) and he told us about a simple CPR training kit designed for seniors groups which we now have. It includes a 20 minute DVD and other resources, including practical simulation, and is suitable for home or group use. Our day leaders have now used the kit and found it useful. If you would like some company on Friday lunchtime, call in at Cooee and bring your lunch. After lunch enjoy the company of others while playing scrabble or other games.

Playgroup has recommenced for term 3. It continues to be a multicultural group with 11 – 16 children attending each session. Mothers come and play with their children in a relaxed atmosphere, and discuss their mothering problems with other mothers. We welcome all congregational members to pop in anytime to see how successful this outreach group is.

Are you interested in Faith Conversations?

"Did you watch such and such yesterday? Wasn't it hilarious? I really like so and so's acting. The dialogue is interesting."

"Did you know that ... is having a sale on all cosmetics? Most of the products are 25% off and some even 50%. I spent \$200 there last week getting many bargains."

"Have you tried the new restaurant at ...? The food is great. "

"I allow my kids junk food only once a week, but they call me the world's worst mum and say I don't love them. They say that their friend's mums are great because they are allowed to eat anything they like. It's not easy to be a good parent."

"My dads' cancer has come back. For the last 6 months he was in the clear and we thought he had finally beaten it but last week at his checkup he was told it has come back. He is so depressed and doesn't want any more surgery. I don't know what to say to him. He has given up on life."

"My gran is 93 years old and is still so active. She takes so much interest in what is going on around. I don't think I want to live so long. I don't see any purpose. I don't know what I will do after retirement. Life is boring."

As I listen to the chatter of my work colleagues I think, "They are so enthusiastic in telling others about the bargains they got, the food they tasted, the movies they have seen. Lord, I believe you love me and have created me for a purpose. You want me to bring light and love to all those I meet and that includes all my work colleagues. How do I tell them that it is You who bring excitement and purpose in my life. It is You who bring meaning. How can I gossip naturally about You?"

I asked X if she is happy in her work and she said, "Not really, it is just the means to pay the bills." She seems not to have an anchor or meaning in her life. She has family problems. I chatted a little about how finally money or possessions do not bring satisfaction and she agreed. I spoke a little about finding fulfillment in using your talents in doing a job well and being of service to others. Where do I go from there? What else can I tell her to help her find meaning?

I asked Y if his father is frightened of death. I told him I believe God has power to heal physical illness but finally God's healing is the help you get to accept your physical frailty and life's impermanence and prepare yourself to be with him. He said he as a child was

taught to believe in God but he could not understand if He was all powerful why He allowed so much sickness and suffering. I said that it was difficult to understand.

How do I share that God doesn't answer the question "Why suffering?" Instead, God suffers with us, standing side by side, weeping as we weep. How do I share that I know this? How do I share the music "O Death, where is thy sting? Where is thy victory?" How may I share with Y that I think that accepting death makes us live our lives fully? Where do I go from there?

Do you struggle to "gossip" about God and your faith naturally with friends, colleagues and neighbours who do not share your faith? Are you asked questions about your faith which you do not know how to answer? When you hear chatter around you, do you think "How can I love them? How can I relate to these people, walk in their shoes? How do my life, my actions and my words reflect God's character?"

How can you tell somebody, who looks at you with amazement and shock on their face when you tell them you meet with the church regularly, that you think your faith will help them too?
