As a psychiatric nurse at Mercy Mental Health I see many people who struggle each day to find meaning and fulfilment in their lives. Poor mental health can cause significant distress and heartache so it is important that as a community we can provide support and love to people around us. Many of us are lucky enough to live in a united family and have a church community to rely on.

Unfortunately, several of the people I care for do not have this privilege. They often feel isolated and alone in their own world. I am so grateful to the Welfare Group and congregation that in a time of need you have shown generosity, love and support to a single mother, soon to have her first child, who has previously felt abandoned and lost.

Your donations will assist her to provide a caring and comforting home for her baby girl when she is born in the near future. But more significantly, your actions have helped to show that there are people in the community who genuinely care about the people around them, no matter their race, religion or past regrets.

Much of the work that I do in the community mental health team is associated with recovery. This is not necessarily a cure for symptoms but more a journey towards a greater understanding of self and finding meaning and direction in life. You have all assisted in this process as this young woman learns to build her sense of self as a mother and highly capable individual.

Thank you again for your assistance with my request to help fund one of my clients as she prepares for motherhood.
