Nadrasca Community Farm

The Nadrasca Community Farm on Morack Road, Vermont was established so people who attend Nadrasca Day Services can enjoy the great open spaces and freely express themselves without the constraints of bricks and mortar. The intention is to create a place where people can grow vegetables, herbs, flowers, strike cuttings, plant shrubs and fruit trees, engage in art, maintain the grounds or just kick a football.

Since 2005 through Government Grants, Community Groups, Businesses and Schools, the facilities have been improved and the Farm is now well established and is accessed and enjoyed by various local community organisations and groups.

The Nadrasca Farm is located on the Healesville Freeway Reservation (from Springvale Road to Boronia Road), which is not required for future road purposes. The potential sale and development of the land for housing and other purposes would negatively impact on the Community in terms of a loss of Open Space. It would also be a huge shame if the Farm had to relocate or be dismantled altogether, having built up a sustainable infrastructure over the years. You can help ensure that part of the Healesville Freeway Reservation remains an Open Space and that the Nadraska Community Farm continues to be accessed by the Community.

There is a 2 to 3 year waiting list for new Community Garden plots within the City of Whitehorse and we see this as an opportunity to work with the general community in a role reversal - the general community coming to Nadraska! The challenge is for everyone to create a society in which people with a disability are welcomed and have opportunities to prosper.

2012 - Another Record Year for Sammy Stamp

I am pleased to report that sales and grants approved have broken all Sammy Stamp's records since founding in 1977.

Up to and including 6/12/2012, sales had reached about \$42,006, a record (last year's total \$33,624). This brings to about \$656,572 raised in sales since 1977.

Sincere thanks to all the volunteers who attended regularly on Thursdays. Also for the extra work you do for the UCAF Stamp Fund's ministry; at home, in the community, collecting, trimming and sorting stamps, etc.

Average attendance this year has been 21.5 (last year 21.1) from a pool of about 42 personages.

I only spoke at 4 locations during this year, compared with 9 in 2011, whilst the Sammy Stamp DVD requests were 15, down from 25 in 2011.
