#### **Thanks for Asylum Seekers**

Our GWUC Asylum Seeker Support Group had a meeting recently to review our activities of the past year, and to plan for the future. Looking back, we are grateful for the support given by GWUC. Members of our congregation have quietly helped to support asylum seekers in many ways, many of them unnoticed by the community at large. In 2013 our collection boxes in the fover received donations of 54 items of bedlinen, 19 items of manchester for the bathroom, 959 items of clothing, 159 items of food, 93 of toiletries and 31 'sundries'. Most of these were given to the Dandenong Asylum Seeker Centre and some specific items to Lentara ASP (this was formerly Hotham Asylum Seeker Project, but has been transferred to Lentara). We are thanked sincerely for this effort and asked to continue our support. Food items such as cooking oil, lentils, rice, UHT milk etc are much in demand, as are household cleaning agents and toilet paper. The full list of preferred items is on the lids of the boxes in the fover. If you would like to be on the roster of people who collect, count and deliver the goods (mostly to a location in Glen Waverley), let us know. We would be glad of any extra assistance!

Last year GWUC contributed \$3500 from COP funding towards the rental costs of a unit housing an asylum seeker family, who have no other means of accommodation, in Heathmont. In addition GWUC members made a large contribution towards assisting in the Whitehorse Council Community Chest, and this resulted in a grant of \$6362, which was a huge contribution towards the annual rent. 'Honey money' raised a further \$650 which was sent to Lentara ASP last October. Lentara ASP is dependent on all this support for its operation, neither receiving nor seeking government funding for its work.

In 2014 Lentara ASP hopes to get an 'edible garden' project underway and we are keen to be a part of this and to establish relationships with asylum seekers in our region. And again, thank you all for your part in our efforts to fulfil our calling to welcome, in love, our brothers and sisters in our community who are in need.

#### A Letter to the Congregation

Dear Friends,

Church Council met from 10am to 2.30pm on Saturday February 22nd. We started with devotions led by Neil Peters. Our bible reading told how the walls of Jerusalem were rebuilt under the leadership of Nehemiah. Neil highlighted four characteristics of Nehemiah's leadership that apply to us:

Compassionate Prayerful Strategic Sold the vision.

Following the devotions we shared joys and concerns. I encourage all church groups to set aside some time in their meetings for intentional worship, interactive and reflective group bible study and sharing joys and concerns.

During the business part of the meeting we elected our office bearers for 2014. They are: Helen Stewart (Chair), Judy Lowe (Secretary) and Ashley Irvine (Treasurer). Vida Foo was thanked for her contributions as Secretary in 2013. We then moved onto other Council business. You can read the details of our discussions on the Psalter (the new name for our wiki).

Finally we had a planning meeting titled 'Journey With Hope' in accordance with our decision in December to have a planning day in February. There were two sessions. The first session began with Neil presenting something of his theology and what he sees as important in the life of the church. We also revisited the Church Structures diagram (available on Psalter) and discussed additions to it. In the second session we revisited the Steering Committee's eight recommendations and the SaltToDoList. This led to further discussion and the decision to convene a combined meeting of missional groups, functional groups and Church Council for more detailed planning.

#### The Christian Church in the World

What has happened in the last months, it is hard to fathom. Our prayers are requested.

Terror and Impunity in Hostile Rajasthan, India: Rajasthan, India, is hostile territory for Christians, who comprise less than half a percent of the state's population. Over the past decade the Church has seen significant growth in the south. Local Hindu resistance to church growth has resulted in toxic anti-Christian Hindu nationalist propaganda, creating a dangerous environment. In mid-November hostile Hindus kidnapped a young believer Anugrag Gemethi (7) on his way home from church. They brutally killed him, mutilating his body to send a message to local Christians who have long lived with intimidation and death threats. The police do not want to intervene. However, if the killers are treated with impunity, then security will evaporate as Hindu nationalist zeal is again on the rise. Please pray for India and its Church.

#### Burma (Myanmar) - Continued Ethnic Cleansing of Christian Kachin

Behind a smokescreen of political 'reform', the Burmese Army is continuing its campaign of ethnic cleansing in the Kachin State. The Christian Kachin have long resisted the Burman Buddhist regime's brutal dictatorship.

Whilst the Kachin seek autonomy so they can freely maintain their culture, the regime wants full control so it can exploit the Kachin's resource-rich lands. The extreme military violence meted out against the Kachin is motivated by greed and fuelled by State-sanctioned racial and religious hatred. Fighting rages in south Kachin State where the Burma Army is attacking village after village, employing heavy artillery, rape and torture, kidnapping villagers and looting.

The Kachin are traumatised, the regime controls the aid supplies and the West appears to have abandoned them for economic gain.

Please pray for Burma and its Church.
