Towards 2015: India, Nigeria and the UK

Three countries undergoing radical change as 2015 looms are India, Nigeria and the UK. Hindu nationalists now control India's federal parliament, allowing them to further entrench their anti-Christian Hindutva ideology. On 1 December St Sebastian's Catholic Cathedral in the national capital New Delhi was torched in an arson attack. Northern Nigerians are reeling as Islamic jihad escalates across the north-east. With sectarian tensions soaring, the economy is in meltdown and, with general elections scheduled for February 2015, Nigeria is ripe for implosion. British culture is increasingly anti-Christian. A battle to define 'British values' has begun and could prove to be a watershed moment for the Church. Outstanding Christians schools are failing inspections because they teach there is absolute truth. Please pray for the Church in India, Nigeria and the UK.

Towards 2015: The World has changed

Heading into 2015, we need to accept that the world has changed. The number of Christians displaced by war, threatened by terrorism, destroyed by violent persecution, crushed by crippling discrimination and even held captive as slaves is growing at an alarming rate. We have entered an age where mission and persecution must be seen as inseparable; where the needs of the Body are so enormous they simply must be shared globally; where faith-building is imperative for the purpose of survival; and where worship must have room for indignation, lament and the very serious business of intercessory prayer. As we head into 2015, will we commit to this? Pray for the persecuted, and for the Lord to revive his Church. For salvation comes from the Lord, by grace through faith.

From Religious Liberty Prayer Bulletin

For facing the New Year, there is encouragement in Romans 16:25-27.

"Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to the Gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, and through the prophetic writings is made known to all people, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith, to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever."

As "With Love to the World" puts it: "Every thing begins and ends with God, who can sustain those who rely on God." This is great encouragement for people under pressure from the world around.

An Invitation for this Congregation to Consider

Several months ago the Church Council was asked by the Presbytery of Port Phillip East to consider the possibility of sharing our property with a Uniting Church Indonesian congregation. This congregation needed more space than they currently had for their ministry. The Presbytery said there was the option of some of their ministry operating from our complex or all of their ministry operating here at Glen Waverley.

While recognising that we are a large and busy church, the church council had some excitement about this possibility and felt we needed to explore this opportunity and take it seriously without committing to it. So representatives from both congregations have had two informal conversations to begin to get to know and understand the needs and hopes of each other.

We can see that there are great opportunities for the youth and young adults to share activities or times of worship together. The big question is how far can we go with this cooperative arrangement? Also how does the vision we have for growing our own ministry and mission fit with this opportunity? What are all the practical matters in terms of property, finance and administration to think through if this were to become reality?

The easy option would have been to say this is all too hard and we will continue as we are. But we are in the midst of a strong Asian community and this possibility might be a significant step in growing the work of God in this community.

The Church Council will work with the Presbytery to carefully and prayerfully consider this possibility. The Church Council will not rush this process as it is very important that a wise and considered decision is made. We are interested to hear any feedback on this matter. You may just want to chat about it with members of church council or the ministry team. We have not got a firm proposal at this stage. As things become clearer about hopes and possibilities we will share them with the congregation.

Please be aware that as the discussions progress and if there is a proposal coming forward it will be the congregation that will make the final decision. This is too big to be a decision for Church Council. The Church Council will resource you with the material you will need to make a prayerful and considered discernment.
