# Sacred Space

For many of us, the main body of our church is a sacred space that we can use any time when the church is open. However sometimes a less public, more private space would be better. The Church Council have approved a six month trial of using the vestry as a 'Sacred Space' where people can go to quietly reflect on their spiritual life.

The vestry will be furnished and decorated over coming weeks to be conducive to private reflection and meditation. However, the vestry is now available for anyone who would like to use it as a Sacred Space. To be a safe place, Uniting Church rules require that the blinds on the window remain open. If you see anyone in the Sacred Space, please understand that they may wish to be left alone and do not disturb them.

The Sacred Space is:

- a space where people may spend some uninterrupted quiet time.
- a place to be still, and be aware of divine presence.
- a safe place, where one my cry (grieve) or laugh or pray.
- a silent place: a place to breathe and to listen, where the need to be silent is respected by others.
- a sacred place to nurture the soul; to relax; to feel God's love surrounding you; to be happy and thankful.

As Psalm 46:10 says, 'Be still, and know that I am God'.

### Material Aid Offering for Wesley Mission

Glen Waverley Uniting Church Outreach Group is introducing a 'material aid offering' to our worship services on the second Sunday of each month. The first one on Sunday March 8 will be in aid of Wesley Mission Victoria Homelessness and Support Services (WHSS) in Ringwood.

WHSS supports almost five thousand homeless, disadvantaged, marginalised, or otherwise vulnerable families and individuals in crisis each year, regardless of age, race, religion or gender, to improve their life outcomes. WHSS does this largely by emergency relief and material aid, particularly food to people in crisis, through distribution at the WHSS Centre in Ringwood.

Could those people wishing to donate items please place them in the basket which will be brought forward and dedicated with the regular monetary offering during the service. If unable to attend the service, please place them in the collection box in the foyer during the week preceding March 8. Thank you.

The following is a list of the kinds of things WHSS will have use for. All non-perishable donations are welcome, in particular:

- Breakfast cereal, long life milk, biscuits, coffee, tea, Milo
- Spreads (vegemite, peanut butter, jam, etc)
- Rice, pasta, instant noodles
- Tomato puree for spaghetti sauce
- Ready-made meals in cans
- Tinned tomatoes, tinned fish, tinned vegetables
- Toiletries including toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, shampoo, deodorant and toilet paper.

Please note: It is actually more useful to those in need to receive smaller jars or cans rather than large or 'economy size' items.

On behalf of Glen Waverley Uniting Church I was pleased recently to receive the following correspondence from Lentara with regard to monies that we have sent.

"On behalf of Lentara UnitingCare, I would like to thank you and the Glen Waverley Uniting Church for donating a cheque for \$1,000. Your generous donation will make a positive difference in the lives of people seeking asylum we support.

The asylum seeker community is arguably one of the most disadvantaged groups within Australia. Many of our clients have travelled great distances and lived with acute uncertainty for long periods of time. Some have fled warravaged regions and witnessed or experienced inhumane treatment.

I appreciate the Glen Waverley Uniting Church taking the time and effort in raising funds through the sale of honey. We are fortunate enough to have friends like you to help us deliver on our Mission of creating opportunities for children, families and individuals to flourish in a fair and generous community."

This \$1,000 amount was gratefully received. It is regrettable that all future honey sales at the church will now include an approximate 10% increase in price. This is as a result of the following correspondence received from our supplier Archibalds Honey.

"Please be advised that there will be another price rise for honey effective 8/12/2014. Honey stocks are very low and honey production is extremely bad again this season, making three bad seasons in a row. This is very unusual and upsetting for us, we were expecting good flows this season but it won't be.

Loyal customers like yourselves would be aware that this is not the way we normally operate."

Return of jars is always much appreciated. Thank you so much.
