### The Christian Church in the World

#### In Laos, Church Leaders Imprisoned for Praying:

On 12 February a People's Court ruled that five Christian leaders - pastors (Mrs) Kaithong, Puphet Muk and Hasadee, as well as lay-leader Tiang - were guilty of a criminal offence causing death. They had been arrested in June 2014 as they gathered to mourn the death of a Mrs Chan after a lengthy illness. Because they had prayed with Mrs Chan, the Christians were deemed to have practised medicine without a licence, for which they were issued huge fines and sentenced to nine months in prison. The Christians were denied legal representation. This is gross injustice and abuse of power by authorities who just want to intimidate and persecute church leaders. Prison conditions in Laos are appalling and torture is routine. Please pray for Laos and its Church.

#### Nigeria's Polls Postponed; Boko Haram To Face Regional Force:

An 8,700-strong regional force is being formed to finally destroy Boko Haram. Comprising troops from Nigeria, Cameroon, Chad, Niger and Benin, the force's expected deployment is in March. Boko Haram has driven some 1.5 million Nigerians from their homes, with around one million in Maiduguri (Borno capital) and some 155,000 in Niger, Chad and Cameroon where Boko Haram has escalated attacks recently. The Nigerian elections have been postponed to 28 March and the Opposition is protesting vigorously. Concerns are that if opposition elements riot then the insecurity will only benefit Boko Haram. Pray for the Church in Nigeria's mixed, volatile Middle Belt and for vulnerable Christian communities in the Muslim north. Please pray for the traumatised and devastated Christian communities across southern Niger and northern Camaroon. Prayer: Psalm 46.

# Material Aid Offering for Open Family

Glen Waverley Uniting Church Outreach Group has introduced a "material aid offering" to our worship services on the second Sunday of each month. The offering on 12 April will be in aid of Open Family.

Open Family/Whitelion's Chatterbox Street Outreach Program is an afterhours assertive outreach program that works with young people who are aged between 12 and 25, who are street frequenting, homeless, or at risk of homelessness and/or engaging in risk-taking behaviour. The program utilises a modified bus as a mobile support base and is staffed by an Outreach worker from Whitelion and a team of dedicated volunteers. The bus is stocked with food, clothing, health supplies and other crisis supports. The program operates 5 nights a week from Tuesday night until Saturday night inclusive. The bus frequents known "hotspots" where there are young people at risk and not only provides a safe and supportive environment for the young people but also much needed material aid. The program is also able to provide referrals to various support services such as crisis accommodation, alcohol and other drug treatment services, medical, dental and general counselling services. The program also offers ongoing intensive case management support for young people who are assessed as being high risk.

The following is a list of things that Open Family will have use for in this program:

- Umbrellas
- Disposable wet weather ponchos
- Socks black or white to suit male or female
- Toiletries Deodorant, no water antibacterial hand gel (small individual bottles), packets of moist towelettes (eg: baby wipes etc)

#### Kenya Again 2015

We are going to Kenya again, June and July 2015, in order to assist the children of the Cherish Exchange Foundation.



Last year's Food Project of \$10,000 has helped to feed the 110 children daily (approx \$0.30 per child per day). However, the falling Australian Exchange rate means that we need to raise \$11,000 this year to provide the same Kenyan Shilling value. Also due to the increase in Kenyan food prices (due to the poor summer rains in 2014 and 2015), they really need more money than this.



Cherish is hoping to establish a Chicken Project to sell the chicken 'meat' - eggs are NOT a good market as a neighbouring country has flooded the Kenyan market with eggs. They need \$5,500 to build the chicken house, purchase 150 indigenous chickens, vaccinations and food for 12 months.

If you would like to assist in these Projects you can provide donations directly to us (or into our Cherish Bank Account - see us for the BSB and Account Number).

We have some small cost items for sale between the Sunday Services photos in small and medium frames, cards, calendars (June 2015 to July 2016), 6 placemats, and t-shirts. These items will be available between the services in April, commencing Sunday 12 April.

We are also collecting children's clothes (ages 3 to 12) in good clean condition to give to the needy children.
