#### Letter to the Congregation

Dear Friends,

Thank you for completing the survey about times for services. If you haven't taken the opportunity to complete a survey, please know that we would value your input.

Recently I read an article in "New Times" (the voice of UCA-SA) on a sermon given by Rev Nigel Rogers in Adelaide last October. He asked a tough question: "Can the Uniting Church make a comeback?" He identified two ways UCA can gain strength: "by honestly refreshing our sense of identity and by strengthening the core of who we are". He spoke about "realising that our relationship with God is the defining factor" of the church's identity; not "our buildings, our liturgy, our music or our societal contributions". He spoke about how "drifting apart from our relationship with God can lead to confusion about who we are and why we do things". Nigel examined Paul's words to the Corinthians -"that without love the church has nothing more than meaningless noise". "Consider the impact the Uniting Church could have", he said, if we related with others "with the kind of love Paul identifies in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7". He concluded by saying that "strengthening our identity and core purpose is an achievable goal for people who desire to see the Uniting Church make a comeback".

To summarise what Nigel said, we are called upon to build one another up. If we are to strengthen the core of who we are as church it will be through our daily encounter with Jesus and in our relationships with others. Through prayers, scripture, justice, reconciliation, and worship the community of faith encounters the risen Christ. The Spirit is a work among us reforming, refreshing and renewing our lives.

## The Christian Church in the World

**Pakistani Taliban Targets the Church** - On Sunday 15 March Taliban militant targeted two churches - one Protestant, one Catholic - in Youhanabad, the largest Christian community in Lahore, capital of Punjab Province. The churches' own volunteer guards tackled the bombers, giving their lives in the process of saving multitudes. As it is, 17 are dead and more than 70 wounded; 20 critically. The Islamic State-aligned Taliban offshoot, Jamaat-ur-Ahrar, claimed responsibility, saying the bombings were in response to the government's crackdown on Taliban militants in the north-west. Doubtless IS's call in February for Muslims to kill Christians influenced Jamaat-ur-Ahrar's choice of targets. As the struggle between the government and the Taliban intensifies, more terror attacks can be expected. Please pray that Yahweh Sabaoth, the Lord of Hosts, will guard and shield his precious Church in Pakistan.

Situation Critical in Syria - In September 2014 the US government resumed sending weapons to the 'moderate Syrian opposition', including anti-tank missiles critical in al-Qaeda's conquest of Idlib. Turkey and Saudi Arabia are planning a military alliance to aid the 'moderate Syrian opposition'. They believe the US-Iran nuclear deal will empower Iran and regime-change in Damascus must happen now before the window of opportunity closes. Over Easter al-Qaeda forces shelled Christian districts of Aleppo, killing dozens and wounding many more.

Meanwhile, IS has launched offensives in both Aleppo Province (north) and Damascus (south). A coalition of al-Qaeda and IS fighters now controls Yarmouk, a southern suburb of Damascus just 6km from it's CBD. The war is escalating markedly at a time when escaping from Syria is virtually impossible. Please pray for Syria's remnant Christians.

#### Parking at Glen Waverley Uniting Church

When our current Glen Waverley Uniting Church was built around 22 years ago, the local residents of Southdown Avenue partitioned Monash Council to prevent us from demolishing the old houses at 15 Southdown and 17 Southdown (two of our current manses) and turning that area into expanded car park. Monash Council agreed with the residents and amended our building permit to allow us to only have the small parking area we currently use, and that two of the places had to be for disabled drivers.

As the shopping precinct has changed around us, the pressure on our car park has increased. As more of our members need to drive to worship and are involved in a variety of events at the church during the week, the car park is over subscribed, and as we live out our mission and expand our many community focused activities, we find the car park is unable to cope with this increased demand. We are limited to our 36 places. If we increase the number of disabled spots, we have to go back to Monash Council for a permit as disabled spots will reduce our total number of spaces by 1 for every 3 new disabled places.

Property Committee have looked at many options to try and assist, but in the end, the conclusion is that if we wish to be inclusive to all our members, to be welcoming to the wider community and provide safe facilities for all our users, we have to rely on everyone being kind and considerate.

One of the more popular suggestions from members is to install a controlled automated access barrier of some kind. Apart from the expense, which is considerable, the reason this will not work at Glen Waverley (and it may at other churches) is around who is to be granted access. Let me give you some choices:-

- Only those over 70? We have more than 60 people in that category so they will not all get a spot.
- Only those with disabled stickers? We have more than 40 people in the congregation alone who can produce a parking permit.
- Only those attending an event? We regularly have more then one event running at any one time.
- Only the volunteers attending an event? We often have 10 or more volunteers at some events, so the guests would not be able to park.
- Only church members (this is a regular suggestion)? What level of membership will entitle you to park? Ordained, Baptised? Confirmed? Do you have to be Uniting Church only?

I could give you an endless list of difficult scenarios to consider, and that is the problem.

Next we are being told that hirers should not get parking. They do not get guaranteed parking. It is first come first served. And we need to remember that the hirers contribute over \$50,000 each year towards our congregation costs of the building. This means that the property costs of light, heating, water and operating costs are fully covered by the rentals. 100% of your offerings go to outreach, ministry and support. So, if their meeting is at 10am and yours is at 11am, the car park will be full.

Yes we have a problem with Restaurant, Theatre and Library parking persons, for which we have no options other than applying to council to have the vehicle towed away, or to set a process of fines. This is what the Church of Christ do in the multi-story car park for their designated spots. This is also hard to police, as we need to know who the cars belong to in the first place if we do not want to fine members. We know that many members use our car park for private activities and this does not help parking demands for church programs.

The simple fact is that no matter what process you suggest, Property can find reasons why it is unenforceable if we wish to continue to have a vision of being in the community. So what is the solution???

Good grace, common courtesy, understanding and planning.

- If you see someone who is clearly not using the car park for the purpose we have, by all means ask them to leave, carefully.
- If you see someone who has parked badly and blocked two spots, if you know who they are, ask them to correct their parking.
- If you are wanting a spot, then plan accordingly.

But in the main, the only solution is to be considerate. Use it if you really need to, park over the road in the multi-story car park if you can. Do not attend one worship time and then leave your car there while you do other things. Be aware of those around you who may need access more than you. Above all, we should consider the needs of others not just ourselves.
