

The Christian Church in the World

Legitimising Persecution in China: On 1 July 2015 the Chinese government passed a new National Security Law. The text is purposely vague to allow the broadest interpretation. Religious liberty will be impacted. According to Article 27, the State will not allow religion to be exploited for 'illegal and criminal activities that endanger national security', i.e. any activity not approved by the ruling Chinese Communist Party (CCP). Groups deemed to be 'cults' will be banned and punished and the State will reject all foreign 'interference' with domestic religious affairs. Over the weekend 11-12 July 114 human rights lawyers and activists were either detained or harassed and intimidated. As President Xi and the CCP consolidate their power, they will doubtless use this law to legitimise escalating repression and persecution. Please pray for China and its Church.

Praying for the Lord's Intervention in Syria: Having seized Idlib in the north, the Turkey-Saudi-Qatar-backed, al-Qaeda-led Jaish al-Fatah alliance is now pressing south into Hama. Fierce fighting rages as Islamic jihadists with US-made weapons fight the Syrian Army and loyalist forces comprised largely of local people desperate to defend their villages. Having seized Palmyra in the east, Islamic State (IS) is now pressing west towards the M5 Highway linking Damascus with Homs and the north. These are critical days. On 6 Aug IS abducted some 150 Christians from Qaryatan, west of Palmyra. Thousands have been displaced from the Assyrian village of Hawwarin and the nearby town of Sadad. Intelligence indicates IS (which holds over 300 Christians in captivity) may be planning a 'mass casualty terrorist attack'. Please pray for peace in Syria and for its Church.

Ping-Pong-A-Thon 2015

The 24hr non-stop event will be held in GWUC Hall at 6pm on the evening of Friday 30 October and conclude 6pm Saturday 31 October. All player levels are invited to attend: from advanced through to beginner level.

Join in with more than 1,500 everyday Aussie blokes of all ages in bringing freedom, hope and a future to young people in SE Asia whose lives are vulnerable to exploitation.

Ping-Pong-A-Thon events began in 2011 when one passionate Aussie bloke gathered 15 mates for the first 24 hour table tennis marathon. They raised \$10,000, which supported the work of two organisations in Thailand engaged in prevention and aftercare relating to issues of trafficking and sexual exploitation.

The 2012 event saw sixty men raise \$25,000 and in the process become better equipped as advocates for some of the world's most vulnerable and exploited people. Funds enabled the continued growth and expansion of The Sold Project and Urban Light in Thailand.

In 2013, with five event venues, \$56,000 was raised by 260 boys/men (from 9 to 78 years of age) to support the work of seven organisations throughout South East Asia who are creatively supporting the hopes and dreams of young people impacted by injustice/exploitation.

2014 saw 800 boys/men participate in 24 venues throughout Australia, raising \$110,000. For the first time the event was run in schools, sporting clubs, open air community spaces & in a local pub!

Future of the Pong

In October 2015, The Pong will become a truly national event with venues in all states and territories across Australia. It is anticipated that 1,500+ boys/men will engage in the event across 40 venues.

Planning is underway to take The Pong beyond Australian shores and to develop the event for different contexts (Pong Schools and Pong In A Pub) in 2016/17.

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

When we gathered as the body of Christ for the 14th Assembly in Perth this passage of Scripture was in my mind: "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4: 2, 3).

At the 14th Assembly meeting we received the Report of the Task Group on the Theology of Marriage and Public Covenants for Same-Gender Relationships within the Uniting Church. This work was commenced by the Doctrine Working Group on referral from the 13th Assembly in 2012. A challenging, at times difficult and emotional discussion of the report and the proposals arising from the report took place over a number of sessions. The Uniting Aboriginal & Islander Christian Congress exercised their right not to participate in the discussion, but remained in the gathering. The National Multi Cultural Ministry Reference Committee urged us through their paper to make 'space for grace'. I now write to you as members of the Uniting Church expressing the pastoral concerns of the gathering for the whole church.

Friends, we continue as a community of culturally and linguistically diverse people to have respectful conversations. We will employ culturally sensitive processes, to be determined by the respective First and Second people groups within our church. We have been encouraged by the National Multi-Cultural Ministry Reference Committee to allow the space for grace. In this space different communities will firstly, be able to engage with the concept of marriage and secondly, they may engage with the concept of same gender relationships.

We seek to be an inclusive church that celebrates diversity and embraces LGBTIQ people as full members of the church community. For the times we have failed to be this loving community of Christ and caused hurt, we apologise, ask forgiveness and pray for healing and reconciliation for us all.

Christian community modelled on Jesus' unconditional love and acceptance is what we strive to attain. We know that the world is watching to see how we treat one another. Paul says in Romans we belong to one another, the commandment is to love, to put the interests of others ahead of our own interests.

In this next three years my prayer for us all is that we might listen deeply to one another, with our heart and to the Spirit who grants us understanding beyond human wisdom.
