The Christian Church in the World

Be awake: the following is amazing and disappointing.

The UN, Saudi Arabia & International Human Rights: The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) has appointed Saudi Arabia as the Chair of the 5-member Consultative Group which is tasked with finding candidates to fill human rights posts around the world, investigating for and reporting back to the UNHRC in Geneva. Thus these 'experts' who report on countries such as ucan, or on issues such as religious liberty or "Islamophobia' (for example), will have been approved by Saudi Arabia. Yet Saudi Arabia is one of the world's worst human rights abusers. There is absolutely no religious freedom; public expression of Christianity is forbidden; house churches are banned; apostates are killed. May this episode expose the situation in Saudi Arabia and the shortcomings of the UN. Please pray for the Church in Saudi Arabia.

The Plight of Assyrian Captives in Syria: Islamic State (IS) has released two new videos. The first shows three Assyrian Christian men from more than 200 taken captive in north-eastern Hasakah Province in February. After these three are executed, three more appear and kneel behind the dead. They confirm IS is holding 'dozens of us' who will be killed if ransom (estimated at \$10 million) is not paid. The second video shows Assyrian Christians taken captive during the August conquest of Qaryatayn in central Homs Province. They are signing a dhimma contract guaranteeing the Christian's right to life as second-class citizens, provided they pay jizya (protection money) and submit to Islam refraining from public Christianity, respecting Muslims and Islam. Fahid Khazaal was martyred for refusing to convert or submit. Please pray for Assyrian Christians and for Syria.

Campaign for Australian Aid

I recently attended a meeting where representatives of 19 local churches were in attendance. It was a meeting under the banner of Campaign for Australian Aid which is a joint initiative of Make Poverty History, The Micah Challenge and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and represents a group of people who believe Australia can and should do more to end extreme poverty around the world. Many groups have joined the campaign including the Uniting Church Justice and International Mission Unit of our Synod.

The Campaign wants Australia to work towards keeping its international commitments of aid representing 0.7% of Gross National Income by 2030 as a means of meeting agreed goals. We have currently declined to 0.25% of GNI. We want aid to be well targeted toward addressing poverty with a high level of accountability.

About 40 people attended the meeting from 19 different churches and while not all held the same view, we did resolve to hold a forum to raise the issue of Australian Aid and to educate people and to encourage dialogue on this important matter. We have invited politicians to attend and address the meeting and a CEO of an Aid agency. We are still finalising the forum arrangements but it will be held on Wednesday 4 November. Look out for more details including time and location.

Partnership Update from the Ministry Team

At the last Congregational meeting Neil briefly outlined some of the possibilities that were emerging where this congregation might be able to establish a partnership with a local organisation. We felt it was time to offer a further update and share some possibilities where you might like to consider being involved.

This week Neil and Nancye met with the principal of **Glenallen School** for a tour of the school and conversation about a possible involvement in the school from our church. This followed the appeal that the church held to support Jye who needed an upgrade to his wheelchair and his mother could not afford her contribution. We were able to raise the whole of the \$2437 that was required as a contribution from the family. I had written to the principal and asked him to convey to the family that we wanted them to know that there were people in the community who cared about them and their situation. The school and family know this gift is coming from Glen Waverley Uniting Church. So to all those who contributed we and the school say a huge "thank you".

The principal offered the following ways that our church could be involved:


- 1. The school holds 4 working bees a year. They rely on community support for these. They do not expect the parents to be involved because they cannot easily leave their child with a significant disability. So maybe we could get a team together to attend 2 working bees a year. A recent working bee worked on gardens and cleaning windows.
- 2. There are opportunities to volunteer time in the school class rooms eg assisting in the art room. This requires a Working with Children Check and compulsory attendance at a workshop on procedures.
- 3. There might be an occasional request for financial support of a project.
- 4. The Principal offered to speak at our church.

Glen Waverley Secondary School have invited our support in two areas beginning next year. As the school lost government funding of their chaplaincy position they have invited churches to offer financial support.

The school has also asked our church to re-establish the breakfast program at the school next year and to run it jointly with the Chaplaincy and Well Being departments. This will require a team of people to cook, serve, and to slowly build relationships with students. This is a great opportunity to connect with a local school.

Virginia, daughter of Rev Julie Ross at High Street Road Uniting Church, volunteers at Broadmeadows Detention Centre on a weekly basis. She is part of a network of people who offer support to asylum seekers in detention.

This group has been supporting 8 women who are pregnant at the Broadmeadows Detention Centre. The women have no access to the basics for their babies who will be born in the early part of next year. There is a need for **new** clothing suitable for new born babies including: bunny rugs, nappies, wipes, singlets, nighties, jackets etc. Mothers will need cool tops suitable for breast feeding. Material can be donated and it will be made into suitable clothing by volunteers.

There are children attending a local school from the Detention Centre. Children at the local school are exchanging the Woolworths Ancient Animals swap cards and the children from the Detention Centre are feeling left out in the school yard. If anyone who has some of these cards that they don't want, these cards can be handed to the church office and will passed on to help children to participate.
