The Christian Church in the World

Russia in Syria: The Syrian government has come under severe stress during 2015 as the al-Qaeda-led 'Jaysh al Fateh' rebel coalition has advanced into government strongholds in the north-west and as Islamic State (IS) has advanced towards Damascus. In July the government made a strategic retreat, abandoning the vast east to defend the main population centres as risk from al-Qaeda and IS. In September, as rockets rained down on Latakia (formerly Laodicean) and IS sat poised to fill any power vacuum in Damascus, Russia entered the fray. Russia was defending its own assets and interests, shoring up sanctuary for Syria's imperilled minorities and helping the Syrian government fight against international Islamic jihad. In response, al-Qaeda has called for jihad against the 'Eastern Crusader', in Syria and Russia. Please pray for Christians at risk.

Violence Escalates as Hindutva takes hold in India: Hindutva (Hindu nationalism) arose in the early twentieth century primarily as a response to British colonial rule. India has been independent since 1947, but ambitious politicians in 'democratic' India now foster Hindutva for political gain. Instead of uniting Indians against the British, Hindu nationalists are uniting Indians behind a Hindu elite keen to preserve their own power and privilege. By demonstrating non-Hindus as disloyal and a threat Hindutva has turned India into a sectarian tinderbox. Violent persecution is escalating and will certainly get considerably worse when the ruling Hindu Nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) introduces an anti-conversion bill during the winter sitting of parliament (expected to commence 20 November). The Indian Church is growing precisely because it is a mission focused church. Please pray for India and its church. (Ephesians 6:12-18)

Iona Christmas 13 December at 11am

Some of you may be wondering about Uniting Voices' "Iona Christmas Service" so here is a very brief background to Iona and its style of worship and music.



Iona is a small island off the coast

of Mull, one of Scotland's westerly Hebridean islands. The ancient Benedictine abbey on Iona, was founded by St Columba in 563 CE. It was restored during the Great Depression just before WW2, and the new Iona Community, centred in the Abbey but scattered throughout the world, has brought new life and vigour to the Church through its worship and music. It has become an impetus for spiritual renewal within the Church and also a force for world peace, reconciliation and justice.

The Iona Community focuses on God's preferment of the ordinary person over the powerful ecclesiastical tradition of the Church. They seek to touch the hearts of people in new and challenging ways. Their daily services emphasise that Jesus' message was to ordinary folk, that he sides with the poor and downtrodden and offers hope and new life to everyone. The theme of our 11am service on 13 December will reflect the Iona vision.

The songs Uniting Voices will be singing align with this emphasis. This is beautifully expressed in Together in Song number 288:

Not the powerful, not the privileged, not the powerful in the land, but the no-ones and the needy were the first to hold God's hand. God, determined to be different

from the standards we think best, in his choice of friends and family, lets forgotten folk be blessed.

The Iona Community reflects the Celtic tradition in their songs and worship and traditional Celtic folk tunes are often used for their songs. The worship ideas of the Community are sometimes quite radical, challenging the worshipper to reflect on their beliefs and their Christian life in new and stimulating ways.

Christmas Toilet Paper

The toilet paper is made from 100% recycled paper and the company that produces it donate 50% of their profits to WaterAid to continue their work towards giving everyone around the world access to a safe and healthy toilet.
